Your Dedicated Neighbourhood Team (DNT) is a group of local Officers dedicated to serving your community. The team is made up of Officers based in your area and supported by the wider Policing family.

Your priorities are chosen quarterly and are based upon information gathered through NHL (Neighbourhood Link), social media, local engagement, and emerging crime trends. You have stated that the following key themes are important to you. #YouSaidWeDid

You Said	We did
General anti-social behaviour has been raised as a priority by local residents; this includes nuisance by youths at the Meridian Leisure Park	The most recent ASB issues have been in the Thorpe Astley area whereby youths have targeted an address on several occasions. The beat team are conducting proactive patrols to deter further incidents and working to identify those involved.
Persons involved in Growing, making, distributing, and taking illegal substances	The beat team will monitor for the reporting of illegal substances and when intelligence is obtained it will be verified and appropriate enforcement action will be taken against offenders.
Road safety in general has been raised as a priority. This includes safety around school pick-up and drop off. Unsafe and uninsured vehicles. It also includes speeding enforcement where it is identified as a problem.	The beat team will be dealing with this issue by: Conducting awareness campaigns highlighting the dangers of speeding and its impact. Engage with local schools, businesses, and community groups to promote safe driving habits. Increase patrol visibility in high-risk areas, especially near schools, residential zones, and accident hotspots. Where offences are identified the beat team will take appropriate action against offenders.

News

Over the past month your beat team have been busy dealing with several on-going investigations as well as enjoying some well earned rest over the New Year. PC Dave and PCSO Ryan patrolled the Braunstone Town and Lubbesthorpe areas, targeting anti-social behaviour spots and completed crime enquiries. Whilst on patrol a suspicious vehicle was spotted on Watergate Lane and after stopping and searching the vehicle and occupants, drugs were recovered and the occupants were dealt with for drug offences.

Storm Gorette arrived in some places last month and The Met Office issued an Amber Warning for heavy snow and strong winds. We received a large number of calls about vehicles succumbing to the weather and leaving occupants stranded. However, others including myself were left bitterly disappointed after Storm 'Gorette' missed our homes entirely! During these colder months please remember when defrosting your car in the mornings, never leave it unattended with the engine running, opportunistic thieves take advantage of this time of year and we tend to see a spike of theft **from** motor vehicles and theft **of** motor vehicles. Please be vigilant about your vehicle and your surroundings.

Last month we have noted a number of burglaries taken place at properties off Kingsway, Braunstone Town. Targeted patrols are taking place whilst the investigations continue. Please remain vigilant and ensure your property is securely locked. If you see anything suspicious, please report it to Leicestershire Police via 101, or use 999 in an emergency if a crime is in progress.

One of our colleagues in a partner agency has shared a Facebook page relative to Braunstone Town. Healthy Leicestershire is a new page bringing a unified identity that brings together our public health services under one clear and consistent banner.
