Current Issues & Activity

Key issues that I am aware if at present are:

- Anti-social behaviour in connection with suspected illegal drug use in some housing areas.
- There have been a few reports again of vehicles being stolen, I would like to remind people to be vigilant in positioning of keyless car keys and reporting any suspicious behaviour.
- E-Bikes being ridden anti-socially in and around Hove.
- Anti-social behaviour around the seafront and Wish Park.

My key priorities for West Hove now are as follows

- E-bikes, reports of anti-social behaviour. Aim to identify those involved. Viewing CCTV where possible and working with other officers.
- Antisocial behaviour at Hove skate park, I will do this by working with colleagues to always increase police presence and identify any criminal activity.

There have been some reports of antisocial behaviour at Hove skate park. We are still working as a team and with our councillors to aim to maintain order. If you have any reports, then PLEASE report it to Sussex Police.

There have also been some reports recently of e-bikes being ridden antisocially and causing a nuisance around Hove. If you have any reports, then please can you report it to Sussex Police. I am working alongside other colleagues to try and identify the individuals involved. If you have any CCTV then please make an online report.

Please continue to make reports to the Sussex Police, about crime and any policing related matters.

For matters to receive appropriate police attention, it is very important that they are reported through the proper channels, (see below).
