You Said	We did
Concerns have been raised around drug dealing and drug taking in the area.	An AirBNB on Tuffleys Way, Thorpe Astley was attended after reports of a number of youths being loud and inhaling balloons. Officers attended and dispersed the youths.
Increase in speeding and anti social driving on the beat.	Reports received of 8 males riding at speed around mossdale meadows, one male on a dirt bike and the rest on E-bikes. We are seeking to locate the riders.
Burglary. Issues raised have been converted into new priorities for the beat team to focus on.	A Garage/shed was broken into and an E-bike stolen that was on charge, this has been crimd and an investigation continues.

News

During this month PCSO Duane celebrated 18 years service working for the police as a Police Community Support Officer. Only another 17 to go... not that he's counting!

Officers visited Meridian Leisure Park and liaised with the staff about some ASB and Crime being committed by young children. Children reported to be Primary School and Secondary School ages have been reported to have been stealing sweets and shouting abuse. Do you know where your children go? PCSO Duane will be collecting CCTV and speaking with local schools to try and identify these little treasures.

Officers have been patrolling Mossdale Meadows and Franklin Park after reports of ASB, no persons were located however CCTV enquiries are being conducted. We have put a patrol plan in place for the next few months to increase police presence in these areas. The neighbouring beat teams will be assisting us to patrol on the days we are not on shift.

PCSO Ellis and PCSO Duane assisted PC Claire with a drunk female on Mossdale Meadows in Braunstone. She was safely taken home with a little help from her friends. Just a reminder, though the weather is perfect for a well deserved drink in the sunshine, please always remember to drink responsible and look after yourselves especially when out in public.

And finally, Leicestershire Fire and Rescue were notified of a fire at the playground on Lakin Drive, Thorpe Astley at approximately 0722 hours on the 16th June by a passing member of the public who saw the equipment smouldering. It is believed to be a deliberate ignition and Leicestershire Police were notified. The damage caused is approximately £10,000. We are currently in the process of viewing local CCTV to identify the perpetrators. If you have any information please call 101 and quote the crime reference NICHE 25000349254.
