



Greater Manchester Older People's Network

The Greater Manchester Older People's Network (GMOPN) brings together people aged 50+ from every borough of Greater Manchester to make sure older people's voices are heard and valued. With more than 600 members, they are a strong, active network working to create an age-friendly city region where everyone can age well.

By joining the GMOPN, you can:

- Influence local decisions, services and policies
- Meet new people and share experiences
- Take part in consultations, events and campaigns
- Help challenge ageism and promote positive ageing
- Be part of a supportive, inclusive community

The network focuses on tackling social isolation, improving neighbourhoods, and making sure older people's priorities are recognised across Greater Manchester. As a member you would have the option to attend events, <u>Working Groups</u> and project groups – including the <u>GM Older People's Equality</u>

<u>Panel</u> and <u>GM Mature Minds Matter</u>. You would also receive their monthly newsletter with the latest relevant information and age-friendly events. The network works alongside the Greater Manchester Ageing Hub (GMCA) and is facilitated by Manchester Community Central.

Information about Winter Fuel Payments

Pensioners across England and Wales will receive between £100 and £300, with payments being made automatically throughout November and December. The amount pensioners are paid will be dependent on whether they live as a couple, if they are entitled to other benefits and whether or not they live in a care home. It comes as the Department for Work and Pensions warns of a 150 percent surge in Winter Fuel Payment scam activity. These scams see fraudsters pose as Government officials or payment providers in an attempt to trick people into sharing their personal information.

As payments begin, pensioners are being urged to continue to look out for these scam messages and remember that they will never be asked to provide bank details to receive the payment. Anyone who receives a text message inviting them to apply for a payment should not engage with it, including clicking on links, and instead forward it to 7726.

The vast majority of pensioners should see this payment in their bank account by mid-December. If any pensioner has questions on whether they are eligible or has not received a payment by 28 January 2026, they are encouraged to contact the Winter Fuel Payment Centre on 0800 731 0160.

Winterwise Training by Independent Age

Independent Age offers free training to share knowledge and upskill frontline staff who support older people in their communities. Training sessions are running weekly up until 8 Dec, starting again in January.

Winter can be particularly challenging for older people due to financial worries and an increased likelihood of developing cold-related health problems, as well as slips and falls in icy conditions. The high cost-of-living has left many concerned about food and energy prices as the weather gets colder. Increased loneliness and isolation in winter can further exacerbate these issues.

Equipping older people with the right information to help keep warm and safe can make a huge difference to their wellbeing. The Winterwise course and guide has been developed to address these issues.

The NHS Vaccination Van is coming to Bolton!


