The Landrover Freelander, shown in the second picture, was stopped in Bedworth and seized when officers discovered it was being driven with no tax, no MOT and no insurance.

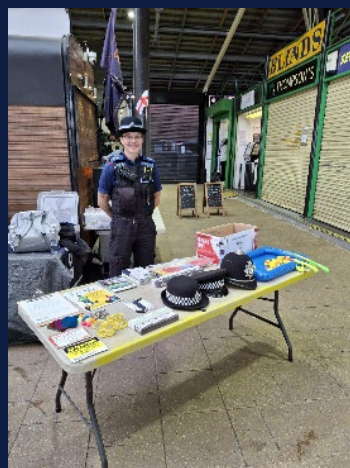
Bedworth Easter Extravaganza

A Visit to Meet the Reel Rod Squad (RRS)

On 5th April, PC Benjamin Pedley of Bedworth East SNT attended Makins Fishery to catch up with the Reel Rod Squad and discuss what they can offer young people in Nuneaton and Bedworth. The aim of RR is to get young people into fishing and off the streets, away from crime. They support people without the **equipment, knowledge or opportunity to fish** and have regular events at different locations. If you have a child who is struggling to find a hobby or want them to try something outdoors, then this could be the thing. Fishing is also proven to help people with Special Educational needs (SEN).



Crimes Discovered in Bedworth Parks

Whilst patrolling Bedworth's parks for offenders using Nitrous Oxide, PC Pedley and PC Rudkin located a male consuming Nitrous Oxide. The male was 'High' from the drugs, but this quickly turned into a low when the pending criminal record was explained. Numerous other canisters were located hidden and emptied and seized.

In another park, officers stopped and searched a male and his vehicle, acting on some intelligence given by a member of the public. A large amount of suspected counterfeit cigarettes were located and seized. Trading Standards have been notified and once confirmed action will be taken on the male and his business.

Nuneaton v Atherstone Match

On 4th April, SNT officers maintained a visible police presence outside The Oval in Bedworth for the Local Derby football match, between Nuneaton and Atherstone Towns. After the match, a minor disturbance occurred away from the ground and Officers responded quickly to disperse both groups of supporters. No arrests were made. We would like to thank most of the fans from both clubs, who came together to enjoy the game in good spirits and helped keep the day a positive event for the community.



Bleed Kits Issued for Siting Around Nuneaton

In April, the SNT attended an event where 23 "Bleed Kits" were given to businesses and organisations in Nuneaton. The Bleed Kits can be used by anyone to treat a life-threatening bleed. They can buy vital time until paramedics arrive, so can make the difference between life and death. The kits were bought in memory of Tom Ellis who sadly died after being stabbed in Nuneaton in 2024. The Bleed Kits were funded by the Borough Council and Neighbourhood Watch and will be kept at locations around Nuneaton. Then, when someone dials 999, paramedic call handlers can direct people to the nearest 'Kit' and talk them through their use. These kits have been **shown to save lives** so whilst we hope that they will never be required, it is reassuring to know that they are there if they are ever needed.
