Beat Priorities for January/February/March 2025

1) Drug Dealing & Anti-Social Behaviour

We have received reports of drug use and associated ASB in this area. Our team is working closely with residents and partner agencies to find long-term solutions.

2) Road Safety Around Primary Schools

Concerns have been raised about inconsiderate parking and road use near local schools. We're working with NWLDC enforcement teams and schools to promote safer environments for children and parents.

3) Licensing Checks

We have seen an increase in issues linked to licensed premises. We'll be conducting visits with licensing officers to ensure conditions are met and everyone can enjoy a safe environment.

Drug Dealing Patrols

As part of our beat priorities we have been carrying out targeted patrols across the Forest Beat, including Moira, Measham, and surrounding villages, following reports of drug-related activity. The focus is to reduce harm and keep our neighbourhood safe.

Community information is often the key to tackling crime. Even small details can help us build a bigger picture, identify offenders, and take action. Your vigilance makes a real difference in keeping our streets safe.

What to look out for:

- ◆ Unusual activity around vehicles
- ◆ Frequent visitors at odd hours
- ◆ Anything that doesn't feel right

How to report:

- ◆ * Call 101
- ◆ * Use Crimestoppers (0800 555 111) for anonymous reporting
- ◆ * In an emergency, dial 999

Licensing Checks

Over recent weeks, officers have been visiting a number of licensed premises across the area to ensure they remain safe and welcoming environments for everyone.

As part of this work, we will be:-

Carrying out test purchase operations to make sure premises are operating legally and responsibly.

Completing licensing compliance checks to support venues in meeting their obligations.

Distributing materials for the Walk Away Campaign, promoting safer nights out and encouraging people to make positive choices to prevent violence.

School Parking Patrols

The Beat Team have been out conducting parking patrols outside Measham C of E School and Measham St Charles School both on Bosworth Road, Measham. These checks are in line with our beat priority and in place to help keep children, parents, and staff safe during the busy drop off and pick up times.

A huge thank you to the majority of parents and carers who consistently park safely and respectfully – it really does make a big difference

Please be mindful of the following:-

- Parking on yellow zig zags
- Blocking driveways or junctions
- Stopping on pavements, forcing pedestrians into the road
- Double parking, reducing visibility for children crossing

These behaviours not only cause frustration for residents but can seriously increase the risk of an accident, especially when young children are involved.

Please help us keep the school environment safe by allowing extra time for your journey and parking legally and considerately. If you are able to walk even part of the way, this can ease congestion and improve safety for everyone

We will be continuing these patrols and working closely with the schools to address any ongoing concerns. If you witness any dangerous or obstructive parking, you can report it to us via 101 or online.
