

What we have been doing in your community

Your local St Giles Safer Neighborhood Team has been actively working across the ward to keep St Giles safe and to support vulnerable residents. Here are some of the key activities from this month:



Traffic operation: St Giles Safer Neighborhood team carried out traffic operation on **CAMBERWELL CHURCH STREET SE5. Wednesday, 1st November 2025.** The operation focused on tackling the issue of illegal electric bikes, e-scooters and checking moped users have the correct documentation. During the operation, officers checked e-bikes and if they have a motor with a continuous rated power greater than 250 watts, or if the electric assistance can propel the bike at speeds over 15.5mph (25 km/h) **In total 13 bikes and mopeds were seized.** Checks on drivers for valid licenses, CBT certificates, insurance, and other necessary documentation was conducted during the stops. This was highly successful operation, and we will continue to work closely with our community to address illegal and antisocial use of electric bikes, e-scooters and mopeds. Further enforcement operations are planned to ensure our road and streets remain safe for everyone.

Weapon Sweeps: To help keep our estates and public spaces safe, the team conducted weapon sweeps in several locations, including estates and parks. These searches are designed to locate and remove any hidden weapons or dangerous items before they can be used in the proceeds of crime. On this occasion, no weapons were found, which is a positive outcome and a sign that our proactive measures are helping to deter weapon-related crime in the area. We remain committed to reducing crime, protecting vulnerable residents, and making St Giles a safer place for everyone. Safeguarding Visits to Vulnerable Persons: Officers have been carrying out visits to individuals identified as potentially vulnerable to "cuckooing". This is when offenders take advantage of someone often due to health issues, isolation or addiction by taking over their home to use it for criminal or anti-social purposes. These visits allow us to check on residents' welfare, offer safeguarding advice, and work with partner agencies to put protection measures in place if needed.

Partnership Working to Tackle Anti-Social Behavior (ASB): The team has been attending joint partnership meetings with Southwark council to look at ways of tackling persistent anti-social behavior in the area. By working together, we can use a combination of enforcement, housing interventions and support services to find long-term solutions.
