Road safety concerns. Speeding, weight limit breaches and parking issues are the focus across the beat area. However, the spread of the complaints is such that there is no one place to focus on, and it will be a 'general' focus across the beat.	Officers assisted a broken-down vehicle on the A444, moving it to a safer location to ensure traffic flow and public safety. Supported by the Road Safety Partnership, they continue to work within our area using the speed camera van to tackle speeding in our area
House Burglary. Issues with Burglaries across the Beat area. Issues with hare coursing.	High-visibility patrols have been conducted around Twycross, Orton on the Hill, and surrounding villages following recent reports of hare coursing.
ASB in Barlestoke, Newbold Verdon, Ratby and Groby	Dedicated ASB patrols were completed in a number of villages, including Newbold Verdon and Ratby addressing community concerns. Officers carried out visits to both a victim and a young suspect in Ratby regarding anti-social behaviour (ASB).

PC Allan and PCSO Sarah as always were working hard last month, patrolling the villages and offering re-assurance whilst investigating reports of anti-social behaviour in Barlestone and Stoke Golding. They dealt with a concern for a female near Osbaston and thankfully everything was OK and no concerns identified; they completed criminal investigations as they hold on to their crime queues and they engaged with our local businesses. They have also assisted our response colleagues with incidents across the whole of the Hinckley and Blaby area.

PC Graeme has been supporting the Night-time Economy in Hinckley Town Centre whilst on night shifts and has assisted colleagues from the Neighbourhood Priority Team with the arrest of 2 persons for Drugs offences which has resulted in a large amount of Class A and B Drugs being seized.

As we can all see and feel the temperature outside has taken a turn for the worse and we are having rather chilly weather at this time, which has made many of us reach for the de-icer and scrapers day and night. Whilst there have not been any recorded incidents to date within the Market Bosworth area, this is just a gentle reminder that you should NOT leave vehicles unattended whilst defrosting them as it only takes a few seconds for the opportunists to steal your vehicles or items from within. Further more, you may find it difficult to convince Insurance Companies of your claim!!!

Neighbourhood and Response officers attended an incident in Desford following reports of an RTC. Thankfully, no one was seriously injured. Please remember that ice and winter conditions can make roads hazardous.



A motorcycle was recovered after it, and a quad bike, were seen riding around a farmers' fields. Unfortunately the quad bike and riders made off. This behaviour causes significant damage to property and land. If you see anything suspicious, please report it to Leicestershire Police via 101, or use 999 in an emergency if a crime is in progress.



We completed school patrols at Brookvale Groby Community College, engaging with students and staff. Parking still remains a issue outside many of our schools and we will continue to work alongside partner agencies to resolve this. Please remember that parking on the zig-zag lines outside schools is illegal and dangerous. These markings are there to keep children safe by ensuring clear visibility for drivers and pedestrians. Stopping or parking on them puts lives at risk. Let's work together to keep our children safe!
