From information collated from local surveys, beat knowledge, intelligence and reports to Leicestershire Police, the following areas have been highlighted as priorities within the community:

Priority 1: Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)

You said: Anti-social behaviour around open spaces across Aylestone, particularly during evenings and weekends. We did: An early evening engagement with residents, including our younger generation who were playing in the Montrose Open Space area at the time was completed. I attended an engagement in the area of Aylestone Farm Shop we were able to talk to the community that were going onto the Open Space Area of Marsden Lane Bridge and The Great Central Way.

We have responded to some reports of misuse of Aylestone Meadows and we have increased our patrols in that area to deter and/or identify and deal with those responsible.

Priority 2: Drugs

You said: Offences relating to drugs remain a concern in the area and so we are seeking to develop intelligence in this area, which will hopefully allow us to take enforcement action.

We did: We continue to developed intelligence and have completed Street Consultations in the local area to gather any further information from the local residents. Spot checks have been completed on both persons and vehicles and persons dealt with accordingly. Priority 3: Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)

You said: Anti-Social behaviour and Drugs in and around Glen hills Boulevard, particularly during daytime and weekends

We did: We Continue to patrol the area, listen too and engage with the community to tackle any further Antisocial Behaviour issues and continue to work with our Partnership Agencies.

Recently while completing another street consultation, I was made aware that in daylight, there have been two persons trying vehicle door handles. Please make sure there is nothing left on display in your vehicle and it is locked and secure when unattended.
