#### What we've been doing this month:

Nunhead and Queens Road SNT have had another productive month. Packed full of action.

This month, a good arrest on the ward! Officers have arrested someone for Possession with Intent to Supply (drug dealing), in the Cossall Walk estate. There was 48 wraps of Class A drugs found on the suspect. Our officers have come across this whilst doing one of their many patrols in plain clothes.

PC Tracey was involved in an immigration operation, whereby 1 arrest was made, and countless unlicensed goods were seized from shops and recovered. PC Holmes and PC Brewer have seized 2 mopeds this month too, one of which was involved in organised crimes! PCSO Peduto and PCSO Baxter have continued issuing Community Protection Warnings and Notices to those causing ASB on the ward – some of those are now being summoned to court.

PCSO Baxter has also been busy training new PCSOs, so that they can help instal confidence and trust within communities and provide help to all residents.

Officers continue to work with partner agencies to reduce ASB and drug use on the ward.
