- Arrange appointments for callers
- Always ask for ID and check it carefully. If needs be ring the company to check identity.

Drink & Drug Driving

During this month officers have been acting on your information regarding to drink and drug drivers, with vehicles being stopped and the driver being drug tested or breathalysed at the roadside. Some of these stops following community information have led to the drivers being arrested and risk being to others being removed.

Community Speed Watch

Community Speed Watch is a national initiative ran by volunteers in communities where speeding and road safety is of a concern. The aim is to monitor and record the speed and registration of speeding vehicles through communities in an attempt to improve driver behaviour, by encouraging drivers to slow down and there by preventing collisions. The activity allows the police to send letter of advice to the registered keeper of the vehicle warning them of the driver's behaviour and dissatisfaction of the community through which the vehicle travelled.

If you have a concern regarding speeding in your community and would like to set up a scheme in your area or join a current scheme then please get in touch with the team to discuss.

Community Engagement or School Engagement

You may have seen via Derbyshire Alert or our SNT Facebook page, the team conducts a lot of engagements within communities and in schools. These engagements in the community give you the opportunity to speak with local SNT officers about any concerns you have, sign up to Derbyshire Alert, complete a survey or ask about crime prevention advice. The school engagements are about engaging with different year groups about different topics and giving the kids an opportunity to speak to us about what may concern them etc.

Knife Crime Awareness Week

Between Monday 17th and Sunday 23rd November, Operation Sceptre, the national weeklong action to tackle and educate around Knife crime takes place.

Throughout the week, the team will be circulating information in relation to Knife Crime.

Reporting Incidents / Crimes to Police

As much as your local Safer Neighbourhood team wants to help you reports should be made, when the incidents are occurring, via the correct channels. This enables the trained call takers to collate the correct details and deploy the correct resource to deal with the incident. By waiting a few days to report, vital evidence maybe also be lost and persons involved remain unidentified.
