#YouSaidWeDid - What matters to you

Priority 1: Anti-social Behaviour in and around Braunstone Park, Cort Crescent and Gallards Hill

You said: Anti-Social Behaviour in and around Braunstone Park continues as a priority concern from the community and now with the lighter nights, we will continue to target this over the summer period.

We Did: The team have continued to conduct a joint operation with our partners at LFRS around Braunstone park. This has resulted in less reports of arson than previous summers.

We have also just submitted a Public Spaces Protection Order (PSPO) application, which will enhance the area and give the team more powers to deal with local issues.

Priority 2: Road Safety

You Said: From Community Surveys and Feedback on Neighbourhood Link, road safety has been highlighted to be a local concern. We will be concentrating on speeding concerns and anti social behaviour caused by e bikes and off road motorbikes.

We Did: The team have completed our first Op Pedalfast, where we have targeted the illegal use of E-scooters and E-bikes. The team seized 8 illegal E-scooters and 3 illegal E-bikes, as well as a stolen motorbike. We will be conducting more of these pro-active operations, which have been well supported by the community.

Priority 3: Anti-social Behaviour (Drug related)

You Said: From the Surveys on Neighbourhood Link you have told us that drug dealing and usage at addresses across the Braunstone and Rowley Fields area is a concern.

We Did: The team continue to monitor and review intelligence from members of the public regarding drug dealing in the area of Blackmore Drive. Due to the information that the community has given to us, we are currently planning to execute a number of Misuse of Drugs Act warrants.

Good news

Here is a round up of what the beat team has been getting up to in August;

- Op Pedalfast was conducted by the beat team. This is a targeted operation to tackle the illegal and anti-social use of e-bikes and e-scooters. 8 E-scooters seized, 3 e-bikes seized and 1 suspected stolen motorbike recovered. We received a lot of positive comments and thanks from members of the community. If there are any locations you think would benefit from an operation, please let us know!
- We were pleased to welcome out new Deputy NPA Commander PS Barber to the beat area towards the end of the month. He joined PCSOs Beth and Julie for a busy and proactive morning, getting to know the local community and learning about on-going issues.
- A new knife bank has been set up in the front office at Braunstone Police Station. Anyone can dispose of a knife safely without fear of being punished.
- PCSO Geoff successfully recovered a stolen vehicle on Wilmington Road. He ensured the victim was informed and the investigation updated.


