Across the local area, PCSOs regularly host beat bus surgeries, giving residents the chance to speak directly with their local officers and raise any concerns.

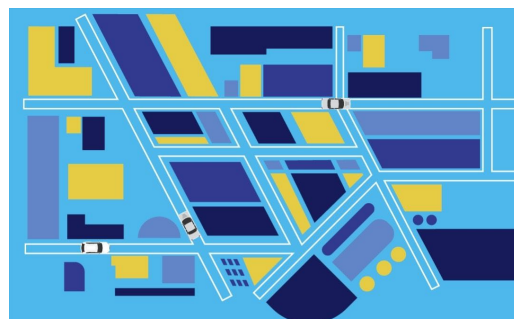

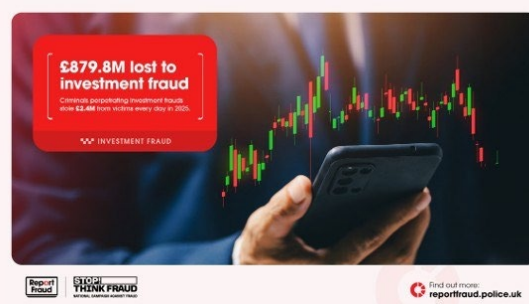
