## What matters to you:

**Priority 1: You told us that you were concerned about burglaries within the Oadby area.**

**What we are doing:** Officers continue to conduct regular patrols of the areas where offences have occurred, these patrols are reducing the number of burglaries. We will continue to do this going forward. Where CCTV is available, this will provide valuable intelligence on times and when offences are happening and possible vehicles involved, to assist in our patrol strategy.

**Priority 2: Road Safety You said: You have told us that Road Safety is a priority, this includes things like Speeding, Insurance, MOT and driving offences.**

**What we are doing:** We have conducted vehicle speed checks at identified locations. Local officers have been targeting motorist's speeding, not wearing seatbelts, using mobile phones and drink/drug driving. Local officers have received reports of identified vehicles being driven without valid insurance, MOT and tax.

**Priority 3: Anti-social Behaviour You Said: You have told us that Anti-Social behaviour causes you concern. This can be things like excessive noise, smoking drugs and more. We will be working with partners to ensure we can tackle these issues and reduce their occurrences.**

**What we are doing:** Your local police beat team and response officers continue to patrol identified locations, as reported by yourselves with regards to anti-social behaviour and drug related incidents. Officers continue to stop check persons and vehicles who are involved in drugs. Local officers have identified vehicles which are related to criminality.

# What we have done #YouSaidWeDid

Some of the key activities over April are listed below:

➤ **Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) Patrols**

The Oadby Police Team continues to patrol areas identified as key ASB locations. These patrols are intelligence-led and focus on preventing behaviour that causes distress or nuisance to residents, including loud gatherings, vehicle-related nuisance, and general disorder. Officers are engaging with individuals involved, issuing appropriate warnings where necessary, and taking enforcement action when required. Our aim is to address issues early and maintain a safe and respectful environment for everyone.

➤ **Drugs-Related Intelligence**

Information provided by members of the community is currently being acted upon in relation to certain individuals suspected of possessing and dealing drugs. This intelligence-led work highlights the importance of community reporting in tackling drug-related activity. While we cannot discuss operational details, please be assured that appropriate action is being taken. We encourage residents to continue reporting concerns, either directly to officers or anonymously via **CrimeStoppers** on 0800 555 111.

➤ **Retail Patrols and Shoplifting Prevention**

PCSO Nad carried out regular patrols around various retail shops across Oadby. These high-visibility patrols are designed to deter shoplifting, support shop staff, and reassure members of the public. Also, local officers from the Operation Detect team which focuses on retail crime, continue to engage with retailers, offering crime prevention advice and encouraging the timely reporting of suspicious behaviour. This proactive approach helps reduce theft-related incidents and supports local businesses.

➤ **Targeted Warrants and Arrests**

Local officers carried out a number of warrants and targeted arrests for individuals who were wanted in connection with a variety of matters. These operations were intelligence-led and planned to ensure they were conducted safely and effectively. We are pleased to report that these actions were successful, resulting in the arrest of the individuals sought.

We thank the community for their continued support and for providing information that helps us carry out this work effectively.
