Think safety first

Knowing where you're going, how to get there and what's happening around you on the way can help keep you safe.

Don't take unnecessary risks such as walking alone through dark, deserted areas - take the safest, busiest route possible. Also be aware of who is around you when using cash points.



Love your phone

Stay safe by thinking about where and when you use your mobile – don't let it distract you from possible danger.

Also note down your phone's unique IMEI number (by keying in *#06# to display it on screen) and activate/download a tracker app to help police find your phone if it is ever lost or stolen.



On the move

Always stay alert and keep a close eye on who's around. Try not to draw attention to your valuables – such as jewellery, luggage, shopping bags, mobile phones and tablets – by keeping them close to you and out of sight if possible while travelling or waiting for a bus, tram or train to arrive.
