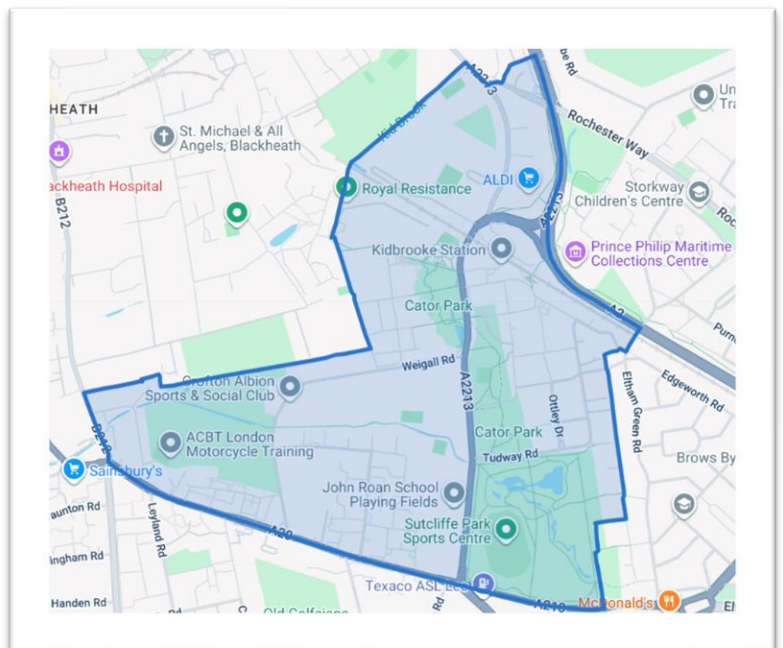

Kidbrooke Village & Sutcliffe Ward

Your ward officers have patrolled the ward and dealt with incidents of crime and anti-social behaviour in the neighbourhood.

The team carried out the positive stop and search of individuals in possession of Class B drugs and this interaction resulted in 2 community resolutions. Officers have been proactive in tackling the issue of drug use in public spaces on the ward.

In May 2026, officers have made an arrest for Sexual Offences, while deployed on AID in central London. Additionally, SNT Kidbrooke Village & Sutcliffe arrested a male for Assault on Police during their response to an incident in Cator Park, which was flagged to patrolling officers by a member of the public. Officers continue to regularly patrol the parks, including Sutcliffe Park, Cator Park, and past Weigall Road Sports Ground, with an emphasis on the prevention of anti-social behaviour and violence against women and girls. The team has been in regular contact with Greenwich Council to discuss joint interventions on issues raised by residents, including anti-social noise and behaviour; officers are committed to continuing to cultivate these partnerships.



We will be conducting Drop-in Surgeries at Sutcliffe Park Sports Centre on **12/06/2026 at 10:00** and Kidbrooke Community Hub, 8 Pegler Square **26/06/2026 at 10:00**.

This is an opportunity for the local community to meet the SNT Team and talk about any issues.

Officers have attended multiple events on the ward and have been deployed on AID to demonstrations and protests around London and we continue to support neighboring ward officers with undertaking mental health assessments (MHAs) by assisting the London Ambulance Service (LAS) and mental health teams at Oxleas NHS Foundation Trust to help support vulnerable persons who are in mental health crises.
