## #YouSaid - What matters to you

We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and the following:

#### **Your Concern:**

We understand that <u>drug use</u>, <u>drug dealing</u>, and the associated criminal activity are causing significant concern within the community.

#### **Our Response:**

While we will continue to take firm and decisive action against those who are involved, we are equally committed to engaging with individuals affected by drug use. We aim to identify appropriate interventions and support services that can help them make positive changes.

Your Concern: Anti-social behaviour is a major concern for many residents on the beat.

**Our Response:** We are committed to identifying those responsible and addressing their behaviour through the Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) incremental approach. This ensures proportionate and consistent action is taken, with the aim of reducing harm and improving community safety.

**Your Concern:** Speeding and road safety across the beat have been highlighted as key concerns by members of the community.

**Our Response:** With the Road Safety Partnership, the speed enforcement vehicle continues to be utilised to priority locations across the beat. This targeted approach aims to deter speeding, improve driver behaviour, and enhance overall road safety for all road users.

## #WeDid - What we are doing

#### **Community Engagement**

**Traffic Enforcement** Speed-calming measures have been implemented across the beat to tackle traffic offences and improve road safety.

**Crime Prevention and Patrols** High-visibility patrols have been conducted in response to recent incidents, alongside house-to-house visits to reassure residents. Officers have also addressed traffic offence hotspots and seized vehicles linked to investigations.

**The Beat Team** recently assisted with the recovery of a stolen motorhome in the Leicester area. The vehicle had been taken from a **Leicester industrial estate**, and thanks to collaborative efforts, it was successfully recovered. The investigation into this incident remains ongoing.

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## #WeDid—What we are doing continued







**Traffic Enforcement:** 

**PCSO Amanda** has been proactive in monitoring areas where speeding and traffic-related issues have been a concern, both currently and historically. This includes overseeing speed calming measures in and around Sandy Lane, as well as ensuring compliance with weight restrictions in built-up residential areas such as Norfolk Drive

#### **Anti-Social Behaviour:**

Over the past few weeks, our local policing team has been working hard to keep Melton safe and connected. Here's what we've been up to:

**Engaging with Future Professionals** PCSO Amanda met with Rachael and several Health and Social Care students from the Learning Hub to discuss the role of policing in supporting vulnerable adults, safeguarding, and the importance of partnership working to keep our community safe.

**Safeguarding Visits** PC Hill and PC O'Rourke teamed up to carry out safeguarding visits, ensuring that vulnerable individuals receive the support they need.

**Supporting Families** A joint visit was conducted with a Melton Borough Council Housing Officer to assist a vulnerable family experiencing repeated anti-social behaviour. This was done in collaboration with supporting agencies.

**School Engagement** PCSO Amanda visited local schools to engage with students and maintain positive relationships.

**Community Patrols** Following a recent incident, house-to-house visits were carried out, alongside high-visibility patrols across the beat to reassure residents and enhance community safety

**Beat Surgery at the Bowls Club** Concerns raised by members of the public during the beat surgery were noted and followed up by PCSO Amanda to ensure issues are addressed promptly.

**PC Ryan Hill** along with **PCSO Amanda Andryszewska** will be continuing the work to keep our community safe and well-supported.

#### □ Crime & Patrols

We have been supporting our response teams with **live incidents** throughout September too and completing high visible patrols often on foot in some of our hotspot areas.

**Teamwork** with other beat officers from our neighbouring beats, assisting them with visiting vulnerable persons, dealing with suspects of criminal activity and ongoing neighbour disputes.

#### □ Safeguarding & Welfare

Officers responded to **mental health-related welfare concerns**, including submitting a **safeguarding report** with the individual's consent.

#### ☐ Station Duties

• The team also supported the **front enquiry office**, handling a wide range of public enquiries including criminal reports, intelligence sharing, and general gueries.

- We continue to deal with local issues such as Anti-social behaviour and safeguard vulnerable residents and cuckooing victims as and when we identify concerns.
- Our work is ongoing with local schools including engagement events.
- And lastly as 'Dedicated Neighbourhood Officers' we continue to work on and try find solutions with neighbour disputes. We also support our response colleagues and cover the front enquiry office too.
