#### **Derby Place**

Ongoing anti-social behaviour (ASB) and harassment linked to one flat. A joint plan is in place with council housing officers to address the issue.

#### **Cuckooing & Exploitation**

Reports of possible exploitation and cuckooing at:

- A property in Lennox Street

Investigations are ongoing and a problem profile is being considered.
