You said - We did

- Speeding (41 votes on Neighbourhood Link (NHL)). Between 01/07/2026 and 31/07/2026 the mobile speed camera visited Lubbenham Hill thrice and the A6 by-pass once. In total four offences were detected.
- Anti social behaviour on the roads (33 votes on NHL) - identifying individuals causing anti social behaviour on e-bikes and e-scooters, passing their names to the council to start the incremental approach. Targeting areas of known ASB activity.
- Drug dealing (42 votes on NHL) - We have been conducting plain clothes patrols in areas we are told drug dealing is an issue. We collect intelligence from residents and Crimestoppers and apply for magistrates warrants and conduct drugs raids on those we suspect of dealing in drugs. We encourage anyone to report drug dealing to us anonymously through Crimestoppers.

This month, your neighbourhood team have been continuing to conduct proactive patrols in Market Harborough. While out on their travels they have located a stolen vehicle. This has now been forensically recovered and will await examination. Their enquires will continue while they investigate its theft to identify a suspect.

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This month, the neighbourhood team arrested a male in the town who was wanted for numerous offences as well as a court warrant. He was interviewed and remanded into custody over a weekend, awaiting his court appearance.

At court he answered for drug driving and other driving offences, after being stopped in Market Harborough last year. He was also sentenced for previous offences of theft and assaults in Market Harborough town centre. He was given a 36-week prison sentence and has been disqualified from driving for 40 months.

It is a great result and given the town some respite from his offending.
