Crime Update

We've seen an increase in reported crime across the ward this past month:

- **Burglaries:**  From 1 in September to 3 in October
- **Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB):**  From 1 in September to 3 in October

Let's work together to keep these numbers low by taking a few simple preventative steps:

Keep a light on when you're not home
Lock all doors and windows — even when you're at home
Keep valuables out of sight
Report anything suspicious to the police

Staying Safe as the Nights Draw In

As we head into darker evenings, please take a few extra safety precautions, whether you're walking, cycling, or driving.

Cyclists

Make sure you have:

- A white front light and red rear light (charged or dynamo-powered)
- Reflective tape or high-visibility accessories (vests, jackets, bag covers)

Drivers

Take time to check your:

- Headlights

- Brake lights
- Rear lights

Pedestrians & Dog Walkers

If you're out after dark, consider:

- Adding reflective material to dog leads or clothing
- Wearing bright or high-vis gear for better visibility
