What matters to you

We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and are prioritising the following.

Priority 1. Road Safety

You said: Speeding vehicles are a concern for you across multiple locations around the beat and issues with weight restrictions being breached.

What we are going to do. Visible traffic calming, speed monitoring enforcement. Monitoring of weight restrictions.

Priority 2. Farming Equipment Thefts and Rural Crime

You said: You are concerned about rural crime across the beat and the theft of farming equipment which has a huge impact on daily farming tasks.

What we are going to do. We will continue patrols in isolated rural areas and visit victims of crime. We will also target those patrols based on current crime trends and intelligence.

Priority 3. Antisocial Behaviour

You Said: You are concerned about Antisocial Behaviour (ASB) This new priority is based on recent incident reviews, ongoing investigations, and your feedback.

What we are going to do. Patrols in areas where repeated ASB has been recorded. Engagement with local children to deter them from any ASB. Where perpetrators can be identified, the incremental approach will be utilised.

Antisocial Behaviour Tofts Hill, Stathern

Over the last few weeks we've received several reports about vehicle nuisance on **Tofts Hill, Stathern**, including vehicles entering the woodland area. Officers have been patrolling the location and making enquiries to identify those responsible.

This closure is in place under a Temporary Traffic Regulation Order (TTRO) confirmed by County Highways.

What "Except for Access" Means

The restriction only allows drivers who need to use the road to reach a property or land located on that stretch. Using the road to cut through, avoid traffic, or park up is not permitted.

Failing to comply with this restriction is an offence under road traffic legislation.

We will continue patrolling the area. If you witness vehicle nuisance in this location, please report it to us on 101 while it is happening or via the Leicestershire Police website.



December Antisocial Behaviour

Vehicle nuisance has also been reported on School Lane, Harby on 26/12 15:15 involving 2 cars and a motorbike reported to be racing around the area and driving dangerously. Patrols have been conducted in this area following this report.

How to report a driving offence:

To give us the best chance at taking action against an offender, we ask that you:

Give as much detail as you can:

1. Vehicle Identification - Registration (number) plate – essential for tracing the driver. Vehicle type and colour – helps officers confirm the specific car

2. Location & Time

Exact location – street address, junction, road name, or landmarks

Time and date – when the incident occurred

3. Description of Behaviour

Clearly describe what happened, for example

Excessive speeding, Tailgating, Dangerous overtaking

Ignoring signs or lights, Drunk or drug-impaired driving

Using a mobile phone, distractions etc.

4. Provide good-quality video or photos of the incident (or have an independent witness)

Be willing to attend court

We're unlikely to be able to take the case to court if you do not agree to attend.

5. Time limits

If you're reporting a driving offence, there are also time limits to be aware of.

By law, within 14 days of a driving offence, we must send a letter to notify someone of intended prosecution. We need to receive your report within seven days of the incident to give us time to do that. If you submit your report later than seven days, it's unlikely that we'll be able to take action.
