As your Christmas celebrations come to a close and welcome the New Year, it's important to keep safety at the forefront of our festivities. The holiday season often brings more social gatherings, late nights, and travel, which can increase risks if we're not careful.

▲ **Keeping Christmas Cheer on Track in Wye!** - Whilst on patrol in Wye, our Ashford Beat Officers spotted a motorbike being ridden in an anti-social manner — not quite the festive spirit we're aiming for. After stopping the rider, it turned out he had no insurance and wasn't riding in line with his licence. He was reported for the offences, and the motorbike was seized.

On a separate day, another driver was also stopped after being spotted using a mobile phone behind the wheel — a timely reminder that distractions and driving don't mix, especially during the busy festive season. The present for them - A summons to court for Christmas.

Thanks to community support and vigilant patrols, we're keeping our streets safer and our celebrations brighter. A little reminder that anti-social behaviour won't be tolerated — not even at Christmas.
