East Sheen

Three local individuals, already known to police for antisocial behaviour and low-level theft, recently entered a coffee shop in East Sheen. Staff recognised them taking items and leaving the premises without making any attempt to pay.

As a result, all three individuals will now be issued with Community Protection Warnings, which will include conditions preventing them from entering the store in the future. This action supports local businesses and helps reduce ongoing antisocial behaviour in the area.

Boots staff recently reported ongoing issues with a local youth who had been entering the store over several weeks and committing low-level thefts.

Staff were able to obtain CCTV footage that provided a clear identifying image, which officers reviewed and used to confirm the identity of the individual involved. Enquiries are now progressing accordingly, and appropriate action will be taken to address the behaviour.



Kew

E-Bike stop leads to immigration arrest where officers stopped a male riding in contravention of regulations. During the stop, concerns were identified regarding his immigration status. He was arrested and taken to custody, where he was processed for the e-bike offence and further immigration-related matters. Appropriate referrals were made including charge for the offences.

Stolen Porsche Cayenne recovered and suspect charged thanks to Kew officers swiftly locating the vehicle using live tracking information provided by the owner. Officers attended the scene and detained a male suspect, who was arrested and taken to custody.

A search of the suspect recovered Class A and Class B drugs, as well as an offensive weapon.

The owner later attended and was pleased to have the vehicle returned undamaged.



North Richmond

Neighbourhood officers have secured an extension to the existing Closure Order on a property in Parison Close. The address had been the source of repeated community concerns, including frequent visitors at all hours, ongoing antisocial behaviour, and suspected drug-related activity.

The extension was granted this month following continued work by officers to address the issues linked to the location. Keeping the order in place will help prevent further disorder, reduce disruption to local residents, and support efforts to relocate individuals involved in the activity. This action forms part of our ongoing commitment to improving safety and quality of life for those living in the area.

Officers conducted a proactive vehicle stop, during which a significant quantity of suspected drugs was located within the vehicle. Concerns were also raised regarding the immigration status of the occupants, and appropriate referrals were made. The vehicle was subsequently transported to the police compound for a more thorough search, where additional quantities of drugs were recovered.
