Your priorities are chosen quarterly and are based upon information gathered through NHL (Neighbourhood Link), social media, local engagement, and emerging crime trends. You have stated that the following key themes are important to you. #YouSaidWeDid

You Said	We did
Anti-social behaviour in open spaces around the town including Argents Mead, the Leisure Centre, and Castle Street. As we move into the summer months, this problem is expected to continue.	Patrols have increased in the location. Reports have been received in relation to ASB in the Britannia Centre and Sainsburys, our ASB recording system ECINS has been updated and Officers are working to identify the youths concerned.
Shoplifting is a persistent problem in the town centre. Having had a successful last quarter in tackling this issue, we are seeing an emerging trend of offenders using the rail network to travel to Hinckley and commit shoplifting offences.	See below for update
Street drinking is a problem in the town centre, with repeat individuals taking alcohol to Argents Mead and Castle Street, in contravention of the PSPO.	A male has been arrested for public order and the breach of civil injunction.

News



Two of your local neighbourhood team officers, PC 1420 and PCSO 6012 and one of our response officers, PC 4209, have been out on patrol in Hinckley town centre during the Hinckley Feast Festival. With plenty of activities, food stalls, and entertainment on offer, it was fantastic to see the community coming together and enjoying the event. Our officers were on hand throughout the day, providing reassurance and helping to keep everyone safe.

Last month we highlighted an increase in burglaries and vehicle thefts across the Hinckley area, a thorough investigation was launched by our Neighbourhood Priority Team, supported by local officers. As a result of this work, four people were arrested in connection with the offending. Following extensive enquiries, two individuals have now been charged with more than 40 offences relating to 27 separate crimes committed across the Hinckley area. The two defendants appeared at Leicester Magistrates' Court and have been remanded in custody until the end of September. This is a significant result and I would like to extend my sincere thanks to the Neighbourhood Priority Team, the local officers who supported the investigation, and the victims and witnesses whose information and cooperation were invaluable in bringing these offenders before the courts. Further enforcement activity will continue as we identify and pursue any additional offenders linked to this crime series.

Officers were called when a store member utilised the retail radio network to report that four females had left the premises after removing security tags from items and failing to make payment. It was reported that each female was carrying a bag containing suspected stolen items. Information was circulated via the retail radio system, including live updates regarding the suspects' direction of travel, enabling local retailers and officers to monitor their movements and assist in locating those involved. The woman had stolen over £400 worth of items from TK MAXX and just under £20 from B&M. All females were stop searched and all items were recovered and returned to the store. Three of the females were eligible for the out of court disposal and admitted the offence and the terms of the community resolution.
