# What matters to you:

Priority 1: You told us that you were concerned about burglaries within the Oadby area.

What we are going to do: Officers continue to conduct regular patrols of the areas where offences have occurred, these patrols are reducing the number of burglaries. We will continue to do this going forward. Where CCTV is available, this will provide valuable intelligence on times and when offences are happening and possible vehicles involved, to assist in our patrol strategy.

Priority 2: Road Safety You said: You have told us that Road Safety is a priority, this includes things like Speeding, Insurance, MOT and driving offences.

What we are going to do: We have conducted vehicle speed checks at identified locations. Local officers have been targeting motorist's speeding, not wearing seatbelts, using mobile phones and drink/drug driving. Local officers have received reports of identified vehicles being driven without valid insurance, MOT and tax.

Priority 3: Anti-social Behaviour You Said: You have told us that Anti-Social behaviour causes you concern. This can be things like excessive noise, smoking drugs and more. We will be working with partners to ensure we can tackle these issues and reduce their occurrences.

What we are going to do: Your local police beat team and response officers have regularly patrolled identified anti-social behaviour locations, as reported by yourselves with regards to anti-social behaviour and drug related incidents. Officers continue to stop check persons and vehicles who are involved in drugs. Local officers have identified vehicles which are related to criminality.

#### **Operation Flux Update - Keeping Our Roads Safe**

During June saw our local officers who were out across Harborough District, Oadby, Wigston and South Wigston for Operation Flux, which is a campaign for targeting dangerous driving, anti-social vehicle use, and road safety concerns.

- Multiple vehicles were stopped for speeding, loud exhausts, and suspicious behaviours.
- Drivers were breathalysed.
- Identified vehicles seized for having no insurance and an expired driving licences.
- Officers also patrolled local pubs and high streets to ensure public safety.
- Intelligence gathered and submitted to support ongoing investigations.

### **Neighbourhood Policing Week of Action 2025**

Oadby Neighbourhood joined police forces up and down the country to celebrate neighbourhood policing week of action. It started on Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> June 2025, where police forces highlighted the vital work that neighbourhood officers, police community support officers and volunteers do to protect the public and keep people safe. As part of the week, PCSO Nad and PCSO Harks conducted patrolled retail locations across the Oadby neighbourhood. PCSO Nad and PCSO Harks engaged with staff and were visible to deter potential thefts before they happen. In addition, as part of local ongoing investigations in tackling retail crime, proactive work has been carried out by our retail crime team. This has resulted in arresting key prolific offenders which have led to prosecutions.
