Introduction: John Murray as chair. About 40 attendees.

Apologies: PC Singh , PC Cullen and PC Santos, Also Jan Bibby.

Minutes from last meeting agreed by CLLR Nicholls, seconded by Alan Dunnett

Matters arising from last meeting:

Speeding - update SGT Paul Rogers – No courses currently available- exploring traffic calming measures.

Lime Bikes- CLLR Dalton in conversation with Lime re storage.

TFL- SGT Rogers asked attendees to report all cases of ASB to BTP.

Question re TFL terminating buses at the white house late at night , concerns for womens safety .

SGT Rogers said TFL under no obligation to adhere to police advice.

Billy Martin asked about parking issues in Westbrook Avenue and the marking out clear bays in street.

This is a local council issue.

Unsolved crime figures - to be looked at by SGT Rogers. John confirmed this has also been raised at the SNB and at the quarterly Inspectors meetings he attends. More to follow on this – its not as easy to do this as you might think.

Update on Delivery driver on Ukraine plates given by SGT Rogers - allowed to operate for 6 months. Driver will be questioned if seen.

CHAIRS STATEMENT FOR 14th JANUARY 2026 MEETING.

1. In terms of scam figures I regret to confirm that the monthly statistics will no longer be produced. It takes a lot of effort to set out all these and I suspect that this might be the reason. In adding up what has been issued, the cumulative loss for nine months of the year was £8,097,150 with 818 cases. In 2024 there were 1003 offences with a loss of £8,767,100. So sadly its getting worse if we were able to add in the figures for the last few months.
2. An important development recently is that the Safer Neighbourhood Board on which I sit is going to have its funding reviewed as it will no longer report to MOPAC but to the MPS. I think that change is good in a way as we should have even loser working

with the Met. So updates on this will follow from our SNB chair Roger Metcalfe as matters develop and tasks agreed. LCP2 (London Communities and Police Partnership) is also involved. The funding aspect covers Safer Space, the One Stop shop and other events. Another change is the retirement of Superintendent Chris Scammell which will be in March. His replacement is already in post – Superintendent Craig Knight. If you subscribe to MetEngage (please do!) then you will have seen his announcement on 24th December.

3. One of the other possible changes is that we may become a “Ward Panel”. We are the only borough in London that call our meetings PLG’s - everyone else has ward panels which have a more formalised structure which we (the SNB) don’t think are as suitable. And they are controlled by the police – ours are community led. A lot of these matters are designed by people who in my opinion don’t understand how these things work in the real world.
