# Neighbourhood Watch - Coordinator Roles & Responsibilities

Neighbourhood Watch (NHW) - Coordinator Roles & Responsibilities

Thank you for your commitment to supporting your neighbourhood through Neighbourhood Watch. Below is an outline of the core responsibilities expected of a Scheme Coordinator:

# 1. Communication & Engagement

- Be the main point of contact for your local NHW scheme.
- Maintain regular contact with your members and encourage sharing of relevant information.
- Pass on police alerts, crime prevention advice, and NHW updates to neighbours.

#### 2. Liaison

- Liaise with the local Area/Ward Coordinator and District Coordinator.
- Know who your local PCSO is and develop a relationship to support communication.
- Represent your scheme at NHW meetings (online or in-person) when possible.

## 3. Community Awareness

- Raise awareness of NHW in your street or area by promoting safety and community involvement.
- Encourage new households to join and help spread the word about NHW benefits.

## 4. Crime Prevention & Reporting

- Encourage members to report suspicious behaviour or incidents to the police.
- Share crime prevention resources and updates with members.

#### 5. Scheme Maintenance

- Keep your scheme information up to date on the NHW system (e.g. number of households, contacts).
- Notify the District Coordinator of any major changes or if support is needed.

## 6. Optional Involvement

- Attend community stalls, events or local meetings to represent NHW.
- Help support local initiatives, such as Dog Watch or Speed Awareness, where relevant.

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You are not expected to act as law enforcement or intervene in incidents. Your role is about communication, awareness, and fostering a stronger, safer community.

If you would like to step down or take on more responsibility, please contact your Area or District Coordinator.
