- Checked on both, burnt out vehicle now removed from Kithurst.

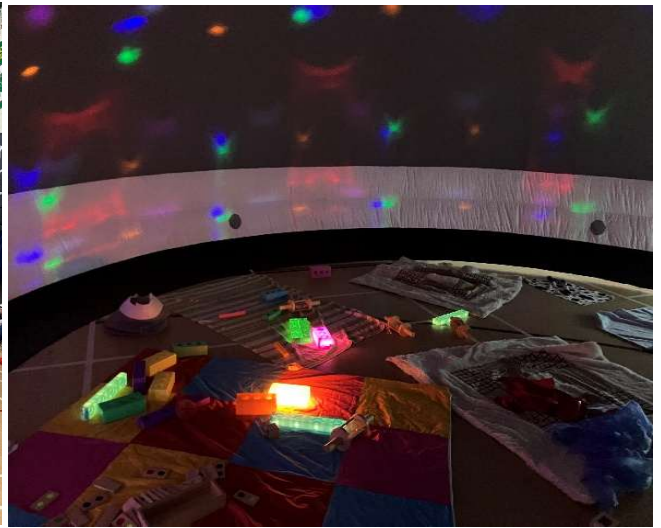
## Young People:

**Youth engagement:**

- Spoke to youths and reminded to pick up their litter they have dropped. Which they did.

- Spoke to youth about gym use and how we can get more youths to use the gym.

**SEND (Special Educational Needs & Disabilities) Stay and Play events:**

- We Held our Easter SEND event in Partnership with WSCC Horsham Family Hub. We held two sessions, one in the morning and one in the afternoon. The turnout was great, and we averaged 40 kids per session. The feedback was positive, and we are looking to run some more sessions in the summer holiday. Picture of the inside our sensory dome.

#### **School contact/collaboration:**

- With Foss (friends of Storrington school) and pupils of Storrington Primary we held a litter pick. We litter picked the cricket rec, Horemare rec, Pulborough road, Memorial Pond and everywhere that was safe.



- Attended Thakeham school with Little Life savers and helped teach the pupils basic first Aid.
- Had discussions with FOSS about the stork day children's parade.
- Met with Primary school FOSS chairperson to finalise the walking bus details.
- Visited Rock Road at lunch time, spent some time with Deputy head Teacher and discussed several points.
- Along with FOSS volunteers and Parish councillors, we completed a "walking bus" simultaneously from the library car park and the leisure centre.
- Rock Road lunchtime visit with Ashington Warden, to catch up with the kids.

## Elderly and vulnerable residents:

### Vulnerable residents' welfare visits and phone checks:

- Gave resident details of all our cuppa and chats as well as our community cafés, as she is struggling with things to do.
- Helped resident with her IT and computer issues. Gave her the name of a local business.
- Had a call from a resident of White Horse Court, she had only just moved in, and her wardrobe door was stuck and she needed her medicine. I visited and repaired the door and advised her to get it looked at by the landlord.
- Visited an elderly Mother and Daughter with additional needs.
- Paid a visit to a Lady who has been in poor health.
- Spoke to vulnerable person to check all was ok.

### Community Café:

- Hanover last one as no support from residents.
- Community café attended at Library, with some new faces. Lively chat with good turnout.

### Cuppa and a Chat:

- Our cuppa and a chat this month, had another good turnout. Big thanks to Stuart and Bill for their help. (yes, that is Bill enjoying a chat with some of the residents).



### Cuppa and a Trip:

- We took a group of residents from the cuppa and chat group for breakfast at the Bluebird Café in Ferring. The weather was glorious, and everyone enjoyed themselves. It was good to see them all chatting and getting on. As for some of them it is the only time they get out in the month.



#### **Hanover Walk Bingo Club:**

- Bingo at Hanover attended, but as there were only 5 attendees, they decided not to go ahead this week.

#### **St. Mary's Church Café:**

- Spoke to the residents that attended, as well as the Reverend to confirm they wanted the soldier figure for their church grounds.

#### **Hazards and Risks:**

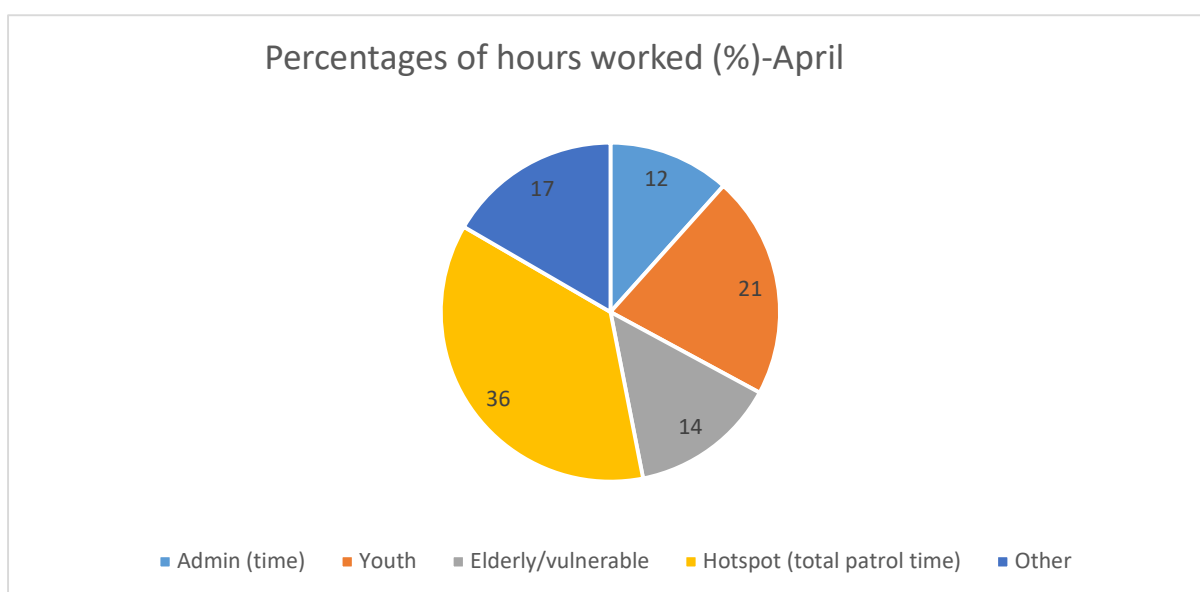
