Police Cadets



We are appealing for witnesses following a serious collision in Redhill. Officers were called to Warwick Road shortly before 3pm on Wednesday, 3 June following reports of a collision involving the driver of a white Luton box van and a pedestrian.

The pedestrian was taken to hospital with serious injuries. The van driver, a man in his 40s, was arrested on suspicion of causing serious injury by careless driving and is currently in police custody.

Road closures are currently in place on Warwick Road between the junctions of Gloucester Road and Carrington Place. Were you in the area around Warwick Road between 2.30pm and 3pm on that afternoon?

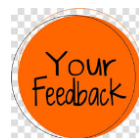

Reports of Anti -Social Behaviour in the Borough in May

During May 2026 there were 22 recorded reports made to the Police of Anti- Social Behaviour (ASB) in the Borough. The recorded reports were received from across the Borough The reports were categorised as ASB Nuisance 19, ASB Environmental 1 and ASB Personal 2.

ASB Personal - incident where behaviour is targeted at an individual or a specific group.

ASB Environmental – actions that negatively impact the wider environment, public spaces, or community surroundings

Speaking Up – Sharing Information

Speaking up can feel difficult, but sharing information should help protect someone and even save a life.

If you are worried that someone may be carrying a knife, or involved in crime, there are several ways you can report your concerns:

Directly to us

If there's an immediate danger or emergency, always call 999, for non-emergencies call 101

CrimeStoppers

You can report anonymously by calling 0800 555 111 or by their website <https://orlo.uk/ali1K>. They will never ask for your name or personal details

Fearless

They are part of CrimeStoppers and is designed specifically for young people to report crime or concerns 100% anonymously, either by their website <https://orlo.uk/ztv5> or by phone 0800 555 111.

Whether you report directly to us, use an anonymous service, or encourage someone else to reach out to us, taking action matters.

Rogue Trader

This year, Operation Replicate brought together police and partner agencies across Sussex, Surrey and neighbouring counties in a coordinated effort to tackle rogue traders and protect communities from doorstep crime. The aim was to prevent people from becoming victims, disrupt criminal behaviour, and protect those most at risk.

Rogue traders often target vulnerable people, such as older residents or those living alone. They go door-to-door offering services like roofing, driveway repairs or gardening, often claiming urgent work is needed and using pressure to secure quick agreement and large upfront payments. The work is often poor, incomplete or unnecessary.

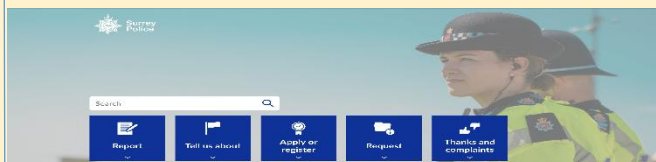


Crime statistics – March 2026 to May 2026

Residential Burglaries	19(8)	14(5)	8 (8)
Keyless Car Theft	9	9	7

There is another decrease in the number of actual residential burglaries in May 2026, following a decrease in April 2026. Keyless Car theft in May 2026 is down from April 2026, Records show that there were 22 reports of Personal Fraud (scams) in May 2026, an increase from April 2026
