What matters to you

- Anti Social Behaviour —You have told us that Anti-Social behaviour causes you concern. This can be
 things like excessive noise, parties, smoking drugs and more. We will be working with partners to ensure
 we can tackle these issues and prevent them occurring again.
- Motor vehicle crime—You told us that you were concerned about vehicle crime. This can be theft of motor vehicles or theft from motor vehicles, this also includes theft of tools from vans and theft of catalytic convertors.
- Road Safety—You have told us that Road Safety is a priority, this includes things like Speeding, Insurance,
 MOT and driving offences.

What have we done #yousaidwedid

- Anti Social Behaviour—The local neighbourhood team conduct regular patrols in highlighted problem areas.
 - Officers will advertise on our social media channels when they are out and about patrolling We record all ASB on our shared system with Harborough District Council and together we will do what we
 - can to reduce problems and provide you with the satisfaction.

 We continue to encourage you to report concerns and locations to us, we need this information to conduct more targeted patrols.
- Road Safety—the local beat team regularly conduct speed checks and deal with any traffic issues that are
 reported on the beat. We endeavour to update via social media or Neighbourhood Link when we complete
 these duties.

What have we done #yousaidwedid

Speed Op:

The local beat team with assistance from the Lutterworth team completed a speeding op on the 19th of June. We went to Walton village, Coventry Road in Broughton and Station Road in Broughton to conduct speed checks.

Old Mill Primary School Visit:

On 11th June PC 1230 Burgess & PC 1035 Glover attended Old Mill Primary School to speak to the Year 2 students. They were shown a police car and were able to ask a load of great questions and were able try on some police kit.



Broughton Astley Fayre:

PC 1035 Glover and PC 4810 Breslin from the Lutterworth beat team attended the Broughton Fayre. It was great to see so many people out enjoying the fayre and the weather. We brought the van for people at the fayre to hop in the back and also some helmets and shields to try on.

ASB Patrols:

The beat team have also completed regular ASB patrols around the villages. Checks have been completed in local parks and we have also had a meeting with the local Neighbourhood Watch team for Sutton on the Elms to discuss any issues they wished to raise.

Patrols have also been completed at the Leire Lane fishing Pond on Dunton Road. There have been

reports of youths trespassing the private land and swimming in the water. Please remember this is private property and that there is a hazard due to the deep water. If you are fishing and see anyone trespassing or swimming in the water please report this to the police.
