What matters to you

We have continued to listen to you and the concerns raised. Below has been identified as the main priorities for the beat area:

• Priority 1: Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)

You said: Anti-social behaviour is an issue in the Eyres Monsell area. Specific areas have been highlighted such as Hillsborough Road, Sturdee Road, Swinford Avenue and Monmouth Drive.

We did: More focused high visibility patrols both on foot and in police vehicles in hotspot areas. A number of regular offenders have been dealt with in various ways ranging from words of advice to warning letters.

Priority 2: Drug Dealing

You said: There is a problem with drug dealing on Eyres Monsell.

We did: The team has been working throughout March gathering and developing intelligence given by local residents. We have used this information to detect, disrupt and enforce against problem addresses and persons living on Eyres Monsell.

Priority 3: Road Safety

You said: Road safety is an problem on the Eyres Monsell Estate.

We did: The team have carried out several speeding operations in various locations across the beat. During these operations we use our handheld speed gun to record the speeds of vehicles and if found speeding will be dealt with accordingly. This can range from words of advice to action being taken against the driver leading to points/fines.

Other News

This month PCSO Dyl has completed some good work. Whilst he was out conducting proactive patrols in a crime hotspot area he has sighted a wanted male. The male has ran off and Dyl gave chase on foot. He was quickly assisted by officers including PD Sivac (pictured right). With help from all involved the male was detained after a short chase. Well done to to PCSO Dyl and especially PD Sivac!

Now the evenings are lighter the issues with off-road bikes, mini mopeds and quadbikes are expected to rise. A patrol plan has been put in place to try and tackle the issues and we would urge you to contact us if your area is affected.





Also this month PCSO Boo has continued to work closely with staff from the local shops to tackle anti-social behaviour in and around the Exchange. Last week she attended the Co-op and had to disperse a group of 20+ children. Some were known to us and Boo has engaged and ended getting some positive outcomes.

This month local officers PC Al and PCSO Tay has been conducting proactive patrols in drug hotspot areas such as Rye Close and Whitteney Drive North. The whole team have been developing intelligence and will look to take action and enforcement using the intelligence that is given to us by the public or from what we discover ourselves.
