

## **Brunswick and Adelaide PCSO Monthly Update**

Hello everyone! I hope you had a lovely festive period.

This is your current ward update for Brunswick and Adelaide, looking back at the month just gone, and offering current crime prevention advice.

### **Within the month of December:**

- Reports of ASB decreased from 48 reports in November to 36 reports in December. A few of these relate to drunk and disorderly behaviour and graffiti.
- There were no reports of burglaries in December.
- There were 9 reports of criminal damage in December.



### **Patrols:**

There were 16 foot patrols within the month of December and 4 of these are recorded as community engagement activities.

### **Specifics:**

- There were 2 arrests in the ward for possession of drugs.
- 1 arrest for drunk and disorderly
- 2 reports of damage within Waterloo Street Arch Gardens
- 3 reports of graffiti



### **Key Priorities:**

- To see more patrols in hotspot areas such as the green spaces, Waterloo Street gardens and surrounding roads, and along the general thoroughfare of Western Road.

### **Meetings**

## Advice - Keeping yourself safe driving in cold weather

Driving in cold weather requires extra care and preparation to ensure safety on the roads. Here are some key tips to keep yourself safe while driving in cold weather:

- Prepare your vehicle: Clear all windows, mirrors, and lights of frost, ice, and snow. Use a proper ice scraper and de-icer, and ensure your screenwash is topped up with a winter-grade product. - Be prepared for emergencies: have an emergency kit ready, including blankets, warm clothing and a torch. Know how to operate your vehicle's heating system.
