Public Service



Earlier this month, **PCSD Cook** and a **Leicester City Council City Warden** carried out a patch walk to tackle ongoing fly-tipping. They spoke with residents, shared reporting advice, and identified several problem sites. One resident who had left items on the pavement was advised and removed them immediately. Fly-tipping continues to impact the area, so residents are encouraged to report issues and dispose of waste responsibly.

You told us about recent incidents in Humberstone Park and raised concerns about safety and antisocial behaviour. Residents also said they wanted to see more officers in the area to provide reassurance. **PCSD Goodey** carried out a high-visibility foot patrol in Humberstone Park earlier this week, engaging with park users and monitoring the area. Following this, **PC 1527** and **PC 1511** completed further reassurance patrols in the park. Officers were on foot throughout, speaking with residents and offering advice while providing a visible presence to help deter further incidents.



On the morning of 16 March 2026, **officers PC 1527** and **PC 1511**, alongside the Neighbourhood Priority Team and specialist units including police dog handlers, executed a warrant at a residential address. Inside the property, officers discovered a cannabis grow containing approximately **25 plants** and equipment used for cultivation. The setup was safely dismantled and all items were seized.

This successful operation reflects ongoing efforts to disrupt drug production and protect the community from associated criminal activity.

Road Safety



PC 1511 responded to a broken-down vehicle that had stopped in the middle of the road, causing disruption to traffic. The vehicle was safely removed, and no injuries or collisions were reported. The incident reflects the routine work officers carry out to keep roads clear and the community moving safely.

Safety reminder: If your vehicle breaks down, switch on your hazard lights, stay clear of moving traffic where possible, and call for assistance promptly.

Community Engagement



PC Wicks spent a lovely morning at Mayflower Primary School, visiting the Reception class for their topic, People Who Help Us. She shared stories about the many ways the Police keep people safe, along with simple tips to help the children stay safe when they're out and about – and what to do if they ever find themselves lost. The children were full of brilliant questions, smiles, and curiosity. There were even a few who looked very ready to join the Police one day! Engagements like this help young children feel comfortable speaking to officers and remind them that the Police are here to help.

Officer hosted a **community beat surgery** at Tesco on Downing Drive, as part of a series of engagement events held at various locations across Evington. The session gave residents the chance to discuss local concerns, ask questions, and receive advice on topics such as County Lines.

These surgeries not only help identify neighbourhood priorities but also support the community in engaging with local policing and exploring opportunities for advice, reassurance, and greater involvement in community safety.

Licensing Op



A joint licensing operation took place on NE Beat 17 and 18, focusing on businesses around Greenland Road and East Park Road. Working alongside the Licensing Authority, officers carried out test purchases to ensure shops were following age-restriction laws.

Most businesses passed, but a few failed by selling alcohol to an under-18. Licensing staff offered immediate guidance and advice to help those businesses improve and meet their legal responsibilities.

The operation aimed to support safer retailing and highlight the importance of protecting young people in our community.
