Update

- Team conducted licensing operation with partner agency where 7 stores were tested for compliancy, one store failed this test and enforcement action will be taken with our partners from trading standards and the city council licensing team.
- In the first phase of meeting with all the leaders of religious establishments across Evington and North Evington beats, Sergeant Hall held a meeting with the Christian community leaders.
- During the Evington ward meeting, concerns were raised about retail thefts. Sergeant Hall was able to report an almost 50% decrease in theft related offences over the last 12 months since he has taken over managing the two beats.
- So far, team has conducted 3 plain clothes policing operations at two retail premises. Together, this has resulted in a person receiving a community resolution, a male arrested for 2 theft from stores and charged to attend court. Another male being arrested, charged and remanded to prison for 15 offences.

#OpSyphon

Throughout the month Op Syphon and Op Pedalfast continued to deliver impactful results:

37 legal vehicles were stopped

16 e-scooters were seized

8 e-bikes seized

- 1 arrest or community resolution issued
- 2 intelligence logs submitted
- 2 people stop-searched

During a different Op Syphon enforcement day:

- 18 illegal e-bikes and scooters were seized
- 1 person arrested as an overstayer
- 1 person arrested for possession of a bladed article

A total of 75 e-scooters and e-bikes have been recovered under Op Syphon to date.

These results show the impact of targeted operations in keeping our communities safe. Op Syphon will continue to target the fatal 4 elements of road safety; drink/drug driving, speeding, seatbelts and use of mobile phones. As we enter the Christmas period, remember these to keep you safe on the roads as they are the biggest contributors to fatalities.

From all the staff on Evington and North Evington beat teams, if you are celebrating Christmas, we would like to wish you are very merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.
