Welcome to your Uppingham police e-newsletter. Here you will find all of the latest news from an Uppingham policing perspective .

What matters to you



We have listened to you and the concerns you have raised through surveys, community consultations and analysing crime trends.

Using this data, we have created the following Uppingham Town priorities that the Dedicated Neighbourhood Team will focus their efforts on:

Priority 1: Road Safety.

You said: Speeding vehicles on Rutland roads is a priority you want us to address, specifically the lack of adherence to 30mph zones.

What we are going to do: During August, high-visibility patrols were conducted in the Uppingham area. A number of vehicles were stopped and checked, with positive engagement and enforcement activity undertaken where appropriate. Several matters were identified and enquiries commenced, with investigations remaining ongoing. Partner agency engagement has continued to support problem-solving and address issues within identified hotspot locations. PCSO Wylie has conducted speed monitoring in Uppingham.

Priority 2: Drugs.

You Said: Drug dealing as well as drug use in the area.

What we have done: During August, we have actively patrolled the Uppingham town centre and surrounding areas to address concerns relating to drug use and drug dealing. Through proactive patrol activity and engagement with members of the public, a number of individuals have been identified and dealt with appropriately. Intelligence has continued to be gathered and developed to improve our understanding of those involved in drug-related offending, enabling us to target our resources effectively. Investigations into suspected offences remain ongoing, with the aim of disrupting criminal activity, deterring offending, and bringing offenders to justice.

You said: Specific issues of Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) concerning individuals in the community, 'nuisance neighbours' and irresponsible dog ownership / walking is an area you want us to focus on.

Priority 3: Anti-Social Behaviour

You said: Specific issues of Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) concerning individuals in the community, 'nuisance neighbours' and irresponsible dog ownership / walking is an area you want us to focus on.

What we have done: During August, we have continued to carry out proactive high-visibility patrols within Uppingham town centre and other identified hotspot locations to address concerns relating to anti-social behaviour. Officers have engaged with members of the community and individuals involved in reported incidents, providing advice, and taking appropriate action where necessary.

Road Safety. During July 26, Uppingham's beat team have continued to target community road-safety concerns. Officers maintained frequent high-visibility patrols, carried out speed monitoring with our speed gun and completed marked-vehicle stop checks using onboard ANPR equipment. The latter recently resulted in PC Stott dealing with a driver for further offences of no insurance and having no valid driver's licence.

Crime Trends and Prevention Advice

Throughout August, the Uppingham Team has continued to address reports of anti-social behaviour across Uppingham and the surrounding villages. We are aware of ongoing incidents within the town and local area and have been carrying out proactive patrols in identified hotspot locations to deter offending, provide reassurance, and engage with those involved in anti-social behaviour.

A particular priority this month has been tackling drug use and associated issues within the community. Officers have conducted regular patrols in areas of concern, gathered intelligence, and engaged with individuals linked to suspected drug-related activity. This work is helping to develop our understanding of local issues and enables us to take positive action where appropriate.

As we move towards the autumn months and the evenings begin to get darker, we would also encourage residents to make home security a priority. Taking a few simple precautions can help reduce the risk of becoming a victim of crime:

Ensure all doors and windows are locked when leaving your property, even for short periods. Use external lighting, motion sensor lights, or timer switches to make your home appear occupied.

Keep valuables, keys, and vehicle keys out of sight.

Consider installing a doorbell camera, CCTV system, or other home security measures.

Avoid advertising holidays or periods away from home on social media until after you have returned.

Report any suspicious behaviour or unfamiliar vehicles in your neighbourhood to the police.

We remain committed to tackling anti-social behaviour and drug-related issues that affect residents, businesses, and visitors. We encourage anyone who witnesses or experiences anti-social behaviour to report it to the police, as the information provided helps us build our intelligence picture, direct patrols effectively, and take action against those responsible. By working together, we can continue to keep Uppingham and the surrounding villages safe places to live, work, and visit.



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Neighbourhood Link

We continue to encourage local residents to have their say through Neighbourhood Link surveys, our aim is to keep all residents that have signed up to this aware of issues happening in Rutland.

Our policing priorities are set every quarter following returns of Neighbourhood Link surveys, along with crime pattern analysis data and issues highlighted by of our professional partners.

The more results we have from surveys, the better informed we are as to where to target resources.
