## **#YouSaid - What matters to you**

We have listened to your concerns and prioritised the following in November 2025:

#### **Priority 1: Anti-Social Behaviour**

- You Said: We have had an increase in reports of anti-social behaviour in and around the area of The Dales. Residents have been reporting youths throwing items at houses, and knocking on doors.
- Our Action: Since the 1st of October there has been one crime recorded which involved youths throwing items at Home
  Farm Court. A perpetrator has been identified and has been dealt with by means of a community resolution. This
  incident highlights the value of community engagement and the effectiveness of proactive policing in addressing
  emerging concerns.

#### **Priority 2: Anti-Social Behaviour**

- You Said: Retailers and security at the Beaumont Leys Shopping Centre have on-going problems with youths causing anti-social behaviour.
- Our Action: The beat team and a new team called the Safer Streets Team have completed high visibility patrols. Officers have engaged positively with youths and store staff during patrols, reinforcing community relationships and promoting a safe and welcoming environment. We have now created a Problem Management Plan.

#### **Priority 3: Heathley Park**

- You Said: Concerns over an increase in thefts from motor vehicles, burglaries and anti-social behaviour.
- Our Action: The beat team have been carrying out regular high visibility patrols across the area. These are aimed to maintain community reassurance and deter criminal activity. Since 1st October, there has been one recorded incident.

- A new Problem Management Plan has been created for Beaumont Leys Shopping Centre for ongoing anti-social behaviour.
- PCSO Kurtis with assistance from PCSO Kay from the Abbey Ward, completed patrols of the Beaumont Leys Shopping Centre.
- PC Tony and PC Sam located a wanted male who has been evading police for some time. He was also found in possession of a significant quantity of cannabis.
- PCSO Telat has been busy recovering vehicles and holding beat surgeries.
- PC Sam created a Criminal Behaviour Order for a prolific offender causing significant harm to the community. This has been agreed by courts.
- PCSO Jaik has been busy patrolling hotspots and recovering vehicles.
- PCSO Kurtis and PCSO Telat managed to return a wallet with a quantity of cash back to the owner after it was lost.
- PC Sam and PC Tony seized a vehicle from a female driving without insurance and without a driving licence. She has been reported for summons.
