

- Road Safety - issues with speeding and dangerous driving, especially in and around the area of Gipsy Lane and Victoria Road East.
- Drug dealing/drug taking at hotspots across the beat
- General Antisocial Behaviour (ASB), mainly around Oak Street, Cravens Recreational Ground, Overton Road, Morton Walk and Forest Road area.

YOU SAID, WE DID !

After street consultation we were made aware of constant issues with in the parks of North fields, Issue's with drinkers in the park and also littering with other elements of ASB. We listened and had all local authorities out inspecting these areas and managed to calm situations and reduce the drinkers from entering these parks

Having constant patrols we have been approached by many members of the public to state that it is much nicer to come into the park and glad to see high visible patrols.

Over the summer we are focusing on high visibility engagement and patrols in and around parks and public spaces.

Operation Wasp has been put in place to prevent crime and disrupt anti-social behaviour. Some of the key areas the team have been focusing on are as below:

BURGLARY PREVENTION TIPS

As the summer months now approach us, we are likely to see an increase in burglaries amongst other crimes in our area. This is due to members of the public going on holidays abroad or out of the city along with keeping their windows and doors open for ventilation. Please consider the below tips to help prevent you becoming a victim:

1. Always lock doors and windows, even when you are at home. Consider installing solid core or metal doors and reinforced frames.
2. Install motion activated lights around the entrance, driveways and backyards.
3. Keep bushes trimmed to maintain clear sightlines.
4. Set timers for indoor lights when you're away to simulate occupancy.
5. Install a security system with alarms, cameras and monitoring.
6. Display security signs around the home.
7. Do not hide spare keys under mats or flower pots, consider a lockbox instead.
8. Consider joining a neighbourhood watch group.
9. Notify trusted neighbours and let them know you will be away and ask them to keep an eye out.
10. Report suspicious activity and unusual behaviour in the area.
11. Do not post travel plans online.
12. Leave a car in the driveway.
13. Secure cash, jewellery and documents in a heavy or bolted down safe or consider storing these with an external safety deposit company.
14. Engrave Valuables.
15. Keep an inventory of your items.
