Safety Warning – Open Water Swimming

With a period of hot weather forecast, the Town North Neighbourhood Policing Team would like to remind residents of the dangers associated with swimming in open water.

Whilst rivers, lakes, reservoirs, and other open water locations may appear inviting during warm weather, they can present significant hidden risks. Water temperatures are often much colder than expected and can lead to **cold water shock**, causing breathing difficulties, panic, and loss of strength. Other hazards may include strong currents, deep water, submerged objects, slippery banks, and sudden changes in depth.

Road Safety Enforcement

Road safety continues to be a key priority for the Town North team.

Recently, **PC 2170 and PC 1045** were on night shift patrol when they stopped a vehicle and, following enquiries, arrested the driver. The driver was subsequently charged with **drink driving**. Officers will continue to take robust action against anyone who places themselves and other road users at risk by driving whilst under the influence of alcohol or drugs.

During further proactive vehicle checks this month officers identified another vehicle which raised concerns. Initial checks on police systems indicated that the vehicle had **no valid road tax, MOT, or insurance**. The vehicle was safely stopped and the driver spoken to regarding the offences. Further enquiries confirmed the findings, and the driver was subsequently issued with a **Traffic Offence Report (TOR)** for the relevant offences. Vehicle was seized under 165 of the Road Traffic Act.

Positive Action Taken for Harassment

A male has received a **Conditional Caution for harassment** following continued offending behaviour. The individual had previously been dealt with through a **Community Resolution** and had also been issued with a **Community Protection Warning**. Due to further breaches, additional positive action has now been taken.

Ongoing Patrols – Pork Pie Way

The Town North team continues to conduct regular patrols along **Pork Pie Way** as part of ongoing efforts to tackle local concerns and improve road safety. A male has recently been dealt with for offences in the area and is due to appear before the courts in the near future.
