## What matters to you

We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and will continue to prioritise the following in September 2024.

Priority 1: Car, Motorbike and Scooter Thefts

Vehicle thefts and attempted thefts around Hinckley.

Priority 2: Anti Social Behaviour/drug dealing

Anti Social Behaviour ( ASB ) involving groups of youths or disruptive neighbours affecting residents. Drug dealing , increased cannabis use in carparks and residential areas.

Priority 3: Speeding vehicles and parking

Speeding along residential streets and main thoroughfares around Hinckley and complaints with regard to inconsiderate parking especially around Schools.

#### You said

Vehicles, Motorbike thefts, houses broken into to retrieve vehicle keys or garages/sheds targeted

Anti Social behaviour with groups of youths riding around on scooters or alleged stolen motorbikes without helmets and usually 2/3 up. Items being taken from rear gardens. You have also reported neighbours causing problems, primarily noise issues. Drug dealing around local residential areas, increased Cannabis use and disregard for other residents have also been raised.

Inconsiderate vehicle drivers, driving at speed in 30mph areas, using roads like race tracks, also residential /School parking.

## We did

Reported incidents involving thefts and attempted thefts of motorbikes/cars around Hinckley have been robustly actioned by the Beat Team and dedicated teams. Resulting in known and active perpetrators being 'caught in the act'. Persons involved were promptly arrested and taken into custody. Strict conditions have now been put in place, continually monitored with regular curfew visits. We are aware that there are other perpetrators involved and again, intel is being submitted and gathered in order to deal. It's only a matter of time before they too are caught. We are asking for residents to report anything suspicious and remain vigilant. Thankyou to everyone who has supported us in the process!

ASB Hotspot areas are still being regularly patrolled and youths/adults causing issues have been identified. ASB advice-warning letters and Out of Court Community Resolutions have been issued to persons involved and dealt with accordingly. Concerns around drug dealing and especially cannabis use are being prioritised, with targeted patrols around problematic locations. Intel is being regularly monitored.

Speeding is an ongoing issue and we will continue to target problem areas and deal with perpetrators involved. Dedicated OP's are being put in place and we are putting available resources to good use. ROSTON DRIVE has recently been monitored and in general drivers obey the speed limit! However it's the odd few who believe that travelling in excess of 40mph in a 30mph residential area during peak times is acceptable. 5 Speeding tickets have been issued to those caught. Parking is also causing problems to residents and we are trying to mediate where neighbours are involved. Sometimes due to locations and design of streets ( pre vehicle ) this isn't always solvable, so we ask neighbours to be more considerate where possible. LCC are always the best point of initial contact for advice—Parking enforcement Leicestershire County Council If vehicles are causing a dangerous obstruction and we can use DVLA powers then the vehicles can and will be removed!

#### **Good News**

The Beat Team attended the recent **Hinckley Pride event in Hollycroft Park** and it was great to see the community enjoying themselves, luckily the weather held out too!

We were also invited to the Hollycroft Grange Welcome Afternoon, where local groups 'set up stall' offering advice to the new residents. PCSO Steve, PC Barry and our hard working Police volunteer Jackie really enjoyed the afternoon . it was nice to 'catch up' with our LFRS colleagues and HBBC. All in all both events proved what a lovely and caring community we have here in Hinckley!
