What matters to you

We asked what mattered to you and you made us aware of the following issues, furthermore making them our priority:

- ◆ Anti-Social Behaviour
- ◆ Nuisance Motorcycles
- ◆ Road Safety Issues
- ◆ Drug Involvement

What we are doing

- ◆ **Anti-Social Behaviour:** The last month we have continued to see a decreased number of reports of anti-social behaviour across the beat. It has been made aware to the beat team that there is currently an issue of skateboarders in Lubbethorpe. Rest be assured details will be taken and individuals will be spoken to around these events. We have also been made aware of a group of youths congregating around Whistle Way and smoking cannabis. We are currently in the process of investigating and getting confirmed identifications of said youths.
- ◆ **Nuisance Motorbikes:** Regular patrols are still continuing around the areas of motorcycles are being spotted riding inappropriately and in an anti-social manner. Now the majority of the poorer weather has moved on we will monitor the level of reports coming in around the involvement of motorcycles being used in an anti-social way.
- ◆ **Road Safety Issues:** Over the month we have had an increased number of reports of drivers using their vehicles in an unlawful manner with questionable driving standards i.e: excessive swerving and poor driving standards. This also includes the recent reports of labour vehicles not keeping their vehicles road worthy and posing a risk by not securing rear loads appropriately. Officers and the beat team have been made aware of this and vehicle stop checks will be increased across the beat to educate the drivers around what we expect from them when using their vehicles for work purposes.
- ◆ **Drug Involvement:** We continue to gather intelligence from officers who patrol regularly and obtain crucial information from members of the public. Using this information we are able to execute warrants where appropriate and use these results to further develop our intelligence around the use/sale of illegal substances. We have gathered some evidence and intelligence involving a couple of addresses across Narborough. Leicestershire Police will be liaising with BDC to execute house visits and execute warrants where appropriate.

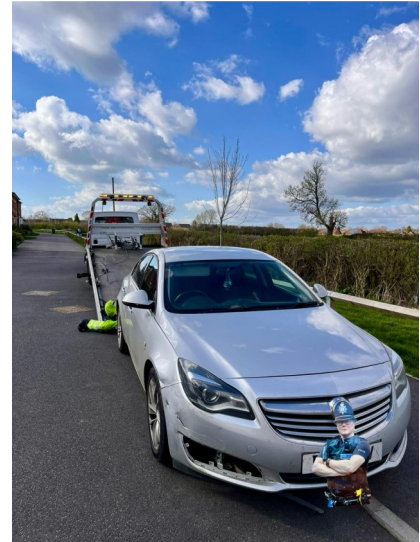
We hope you had a lovely Easter filled with happy memories, and plenty of chocolate!
