You Said	We did
ASB general behaviour, noise issues and nuisance motorbikes	The Fosse Villages beat team are conducting patrols, especially around the evening times around the hot spots where vehicle ASB and cruising has been reported and vehicle registrations will be noted and dealt with accordingly through the Road Traffic Act.
Drug offences including drug taking and drug dealing	There have been reported issues of drug use/dealing across the Fosse Villages. Officers are continuing to submit intelligence reports and carry out enquiries around where the hot spots are.
Road safety including Speeding, obstructing the highway, speeding and parking	Areas where we see poor driving are being patrolled by the beat team and we are also in discussions in launching Traffic/Speeding Operations across the Fosse Villages with the assistance of Police Volunteers.

News

Storm Goretti arrived in some places last month and The Met Office issued an Amber Warning for heavy snow and strong winds. We received a large numbers of calls about vehicles succumbing to the weather and leaving occupants stranded. However, others including myself were left bitterly disappointed after Storm 'Forgetti' missed us entirely! Unfortunately this is also the prime time that we do see some stubborn patches of ice forming at junctions and throughout the more rural roads throughout the villages. Please continue to take extreme care on these roads until it has fully melted. Even at slow speeds, cars can still lose control on these ice patches.

Whilst out patrolling PCSO Danny unexpectedly bumped into a rather unusual looking gathering of red faced men, it was in fact the Hinckley Bullockers celebrating their 40 year anniversary. It was so uplifting to see so many in high spirits, bringing the community together and having a sing-song and dance. No dance participation from Danny though...that would be criminal.



We received reports of an ongoing issue of cars attending Burbage Common Road, Elmsthorpe and committing anti-social driving i.e: revving engines, doing doughnuts and general anti-social driving within the carpark and lanes. The Beat team unfortunately were on rest days and our response Officers committed to other jobs, however from attending the location the day after, some vehicles were noted at around 2300 hours and registrations were taken. We will conduct checks on the vehicles and continue to patrols to see if they return.

During the month we received reports that some powerlines in Croft had 'flashed' and gone 'bang' and had come down and were lying across the main road. Surrounding businesses were in darkness and cars were driving over the powerlines and children were nearby playing in the snow. Officers attended quickly and conducted road closures, we contacted Western Power whom arrived to make the lines safe so the roads could reopen.

Tens of thousands of pounds of damage has been caused at a Car Body repair garage in Stoney Stanton. Sturgess Bodycraft's premises was entered during the early hours of Friday 16th January. Two persons were seen entering the location with weapons and targeting approximately 20 vehicles, some of which had been repaired and were due to be delivered back to their owners. If you have any information in relation to this please call 101 quoting inc 164 of the 16th January.

Officers are investigating a burglary which took place at the Post Office and Newsagents in Croft in the early hours of the 14th January, we are in the very early stages of the investigation so unfortunately I can't disclose much more. We would be interested to hear from anyone whom may have witnessed anything at around 01.00-01.30 hours. Please quote inc number 35 of the 14th January.
