What matters to you

We have identified the following priorities which are in place as of 1st January 2026:

- **Priority 1: ASB**

You Said: Police are working to reduce ongoing anti-social behaviour, particularly involving young people. This includes increased patrols in hotspot areas, early intervention, and enforcement action against repeat offenders to prevent further disruption to residents.

We Did: Issues have been reported around Royston Close, where a group of youths have been repeatedly targeting an address. In the last few days, two arrests have been made in relation to this and bail conditions placed on these individuals to prevent future occurrences while investigations continue. Officers have also increased patrols around other problem areas highlighted from reports received

- **Priority 2: Drug Dealing**

You Said: Drug dealing continues to be a prevalent issue locally.

We Did: Our work continues, particularly in partnership with Leicester City Council, looking at closure orders against addresses highlighted in drug cultivation and drug dealing. Local officers are also continuing to develop intelligence around persons believed to be involved in the drug supply line.

- **Priority 3: Improving Community Relations**

You Said: Improving community safety remains important, with officers increasing their visibility through regular foot patrols. Police are engaging with residents to provide reassurance, respond to concerns, and build trust within the local community.

We Did: Local officers have increased patrols in and around the estate to deter issues in problem areas. We have been engaging with members of the community, including with a volunteer group on Ambleside Drive park who have done some fantastic work. Local PCSOs have continued to hold local beat surgeries for members of the public who wish to speak directly to local officers.

Other Local News

- Local PCSOs have recently visited Eyres Monsell Primary School to speak with the Foundation classes, answering questions from the children. They also showed the children their uniform and equipment as well as giving them a tour of a police car.
- Also during January local officers have continued to complete targeted patrols in hotspot areas to disrupt and deter antisocial behaviour. This has led to two perpetrators being arrested and dealt with accordingly
- Local officers continue to complete engagements around the Eyres Monsell to engage with residents and strengthen community relations.
