#YouSaid - What matters to you

We have listened to your concerns and prioritised the following:

Priority 1: Parking Concerns – Bennion Road

You Said: Residents raised concerns about dangerous, inconsiderate, and illegal parking on Bennion Road, particularly during football training sessions. We have received multiple complaints highlighting safety risks and disruption to the local community.

Our Action: During the month of June we increased our presence in the area of Maplewell Drive and Pinewood Close. PCSO Jaik and PCSO Kurtis have issued parking tickets for obstruction of footpaths. The local team continued to monitor the issue during match days and work with local civil enforcement officers when opportunity arise. Posters have been displayed in the DMU grounds advising visitors clubs of the enforcement actions if their vehicle is illegally parked. With the end of the football season we hope to see a reduction in the number of car parking issues

Priority 2: Anti-Social Behaviour – Beaumont Leys Shopping Centre

You Said: Retailers and security staff at Beaumont Leys Shopping Centre reported ongoing issues with anti-social behaviour involving groups of youths.

Our action: The Problem Management Plan continues to deliver positive outcomes. The local beat team, supported by the Safer Streets Team, has maintained high-visibility patrols in and around the shopping centre. During June, we have continued to work closely with partner agencies to address anti-social behaviour and youth-related offending within the shopping centre. As part of this work, preparations are underway for Criminal Behaviour Orders (CBOs) to be sought against two young offenders who have been repeatedly involved. Referrals have also been made to Youth Prevention Workers to ensure these young people receive positive engagement, support, and guidance from dedicated professionals. The aim is not only to address offending behaviour but also to provide opportunities for personal development and diversion away from criminality. In addition, a number of warning letters have been issued to parents, and officers have spoken directly with those young people involved to challenge unacceptable behaviour and reinforce the consequences of continued offending. We would like to thank Beaumont Shopping Centre management, and other key stakeholders for their ongoing support. Their contribution to developing and promoting diversionary activities has been invaluable in providing positive alternatives for young people. Through this approach, ASB is showing signs of reducing, and we will continue to work together to maintain a safe and welcoming environment for all visitors, businesses, and members of the community.

#YouSaid - What matters to you

Priority 3: Heathley Park

You Said: Residents expressed concerns about an increase in anti-social behaviour, residential burglaries, and thefts from motor vehicles in the Heathley Park area.

Our Action: The beat team has continued to conduct regular high-visibility patrols across the area. These proactive efforts are designed to provide community reassurance, deter criminal behaviour, and respond quickly to emerging concerns.

- The neighbourhood team has been involved with helping vulnerable at addresses on Grassington Close, there is further work to be done and so this will become a priority for July.

- PC's Tony, Dan, Holly have been getting involved with our Council ASB team and completed a number of visits to addresses and attended meetings to try resolve longstanding issues on Calder Road and Astill lodge Road

- PCSO Jaik received a concern about someone's manner of driving and so shortly afterwards recovered the offending car which had no tax MOT or insurance.



- PCSO Telat and PCSO Kurtis have carried out beat surgeries at the Beaumont Shopping centre and another at the Astill Lodge Shops.

- The team have also been tackling dangerous parking and Antisocial behaviour on Bishopdale, again further work is required and so this will be a beat Priority

- PCSO Rianne has been dealing with a number of vulnerable adults making sure referrals have been submitted and that they are safeguarded,
