ASB remains one of the beat priorities.	We have noted a rise in reported incidents of Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) across the beat area of late. ASB covers a range of different things such as vandalism, obstruction to the highway, noise complaints, children trespassing, neighbour disputes and more. We are engaging with partner agencies to work towards resolving the issues
Road safety – numerous reports of overweight vehicles and speeding motorists within the villages. This is being addressed best we can as a small team. The issue remains one for many areas and we understand the concerns. We continue to complete speed enforcement days with the assistance of volunteers and our road safety team.	We have also supported Sgt Alex from Hinckley in some more Op Flux patrols - this operation is designed to target dangerous driving, anti-social vehicle use, and road safety concerns
Rural crime including burglary will always be a priority for the area of NH29 beat. With proactive patrols and having specialist trained wildlife officers, we are able to focus on the issues those crimes that are more specific to our rural beat locations.	Proactive patrols have been conducted around all the rural villages.

News

We are receiving reports of Anti-social behaviour around the use of E- bikes, Sur-Rons and Electric scooters around the larger villages in particular Ratby, Groby, and Markfield. we have also been receiving reports of Anti Social Behaviour at the Martinshaw Woods and at the Thornton Reservoir. Reporting in this way, assists us in identifying patterns & trends which in turn means we can be on patrol at those locations at key times!



A report was received from site security at Groby Quarry reporting teenagers swimming in the quarry. This meaning several officers searching the location to make sure no person(s) were present and in danger. Whilst quarry lakes may look inviting on a hot summer's day, there are a number of hidden dangers: deep water, cold water, submerged abandoned machinery and car wrecks to take into account. Please DO NOT swim in quarry water. These can be highly dangerous places.

Whilst out on foot patrol in the centre of Market Bosworth, we come across a vehicle causing an obstruction whilst parked on Double yellow lines. Despite making enquiries to locate the owner, unfortunately we could not, therefore the vehicle was subsequently recovered. The bus unfortunately had to change its route whilst causing large tailbacks in the square. Also, whilst out on foot patrols, we located an insecure vehicle with the window wide open. We would like to remind you all to lock and secure you property including your vehicles to reduce the risk of being victims of crime. Thankfully the owner for this was located and vehicle secured.

PCSO's Niko, Ellis, Danny and Calum attended a report of 10 horses that had escaped and were running around on the road in the Barlestone area. With some help of some locals these were safely returned to where they belong.

We started one shift with continuing to investigative a recently reported theft in Market Bosworth. This has seen us be supported by the Market Bosworth Hotel, local schools and helpful members of the local community. Piecing together CCTV and seeking witnesses, has assisted us in progressing the investigation - with the view to hopefully identifying a suspect!
