Goldsmid PCSO Monthly Update

Hello everyone! This is your current ward update for Goldsmid, looking back at the past month and offering current crime prevention advice. I am your local Police Community Support Officer, Sophie Hughes.

Within the month of July:

- Reports of ASB have remained around the same at a relatively high number. Again, this is likely due to more reports of antisocial behaviour within St Ann's Well Gardens. Officers have been increasing patrols in the area and noted tents having been removed by the council hopefully next month's alerts will reflect lower ASB reporting.
- Reports of Burglary remained the same as last month, with 1 report in July.
- An decrease in criminal damage from 9 in June to 5 reports in July.

Key Priorities:

- For a reduction of ASB/drug use/drug dealing in the green spaces
- To see more patrols in hotspot areas

Crime Prevention Advice

StreetSafe is a service that allows you to report safety concerns in public places without giving us your name (anonymously). This includes issues like poorly lit streets, abandoned buildings, or vandalism, as well as instances where you feel unsafe due to someone following or verbally abusing you.
