Community Road Watch



Following concerns raised by local residents in relation to speeding vehicles, Cannon Hill SNT organised a Community Road Watch on Cannon Hill Lane, this was a joint operation with the Safer Transport team with a total of 14 vehicles captured driving in excess of the 20mph limit, warning letters have been issued. This is the first stage in assessing the issue on this road. This has now been raised within our Traffic division and we are awaiting a site survey to potentially deploy a mobile speed van.

Youth Engagement Day



We attended the Local Youth Engagement day organised by the Lower Morden Safer Neighbourhood Team, This was also attended by the local Fire Brigade, St John Ambulance, RAF and Sea Cadets, The Army Logistics Corps along with Met Kicks. This was the second time this event has taken place and continues to be hugely successful. We had an interactive crime scene, First Aid lessons form St john Ambulance, Football skills sessions from Met Kicks and Wimbledon Football Club and The Army Logistics challenge and hands on in a real Fire Engine.

Vehicle Crime

Vehicle crime is on the rise in the local area, we have increased patrols on the ward, spoken with residents and offered crime prevention advice. We would advise all residents to not leave valuables on display and not to store tools inside the vehicle.

Keyless entry

Cars with keyless entry unlock automatically when the key comes within a short distance of the car. This can be from inside a pocket or bag. If you have to push a button on your car key to open your car, you don't have keyless entry. Keyless car theft or 'relay theft' is when a device is used to fool the car into thinking the key is close by. This unlocks the car and starts the ignition. Thieves only need to be within a few metres of your car key to capture the signal, even if it's inside your home. This means that even if your car and home are secure, thieves can still unlock, start and steal your car.

How to protect your keyless entry car

- When at home keep your car key (and the spare) well away from the car.
- Put the keys in a screened or signal-blocking pouch, such as a Faraday Bag and check if the bag or pouch is still working every few months.
- Turn off wireless signals on your fob when it's not being used.


