You Said	We did
Reports of drug dealing and using at several addresses on the beat, attracting undesirables to the location and often resulting in ASB (Anti-Social Behaviour) and disorder at the addresses.	We have held beat surgeries to speak to local residents, we are gathering and developing intelligence, and, where sufficient evidence is obtained, applying for warrants. We rely on your ongoing support and information provided by yourselves to assist us in this work.
Speeding of vehicles along several roads on the beat, breaches of weight restrictions and bridge strikes all lead to a feeling amongst the community that road safety is an issue.	We have been conducting regular patrols to improve road safety across the area, including stopping vehicles where offences have been identified. Officers have taken action in relation to issues such as speeding, mobile phone use and other road traffic offences as well as engaging with drivers to offer advice and promote safer driving.
Theft of and theft from motor vehicles continues to be a problem over the Greater Hinckley beat area.	Reports of a theft of a motorbike from Upper Bond Street. Officers are investigating and conducting CCTV enquiries.

With regular bike meets at Stoney Cove and Triumph on the Hinckley and Blaby NPA, riders are encouraged to stay vigilant. Please be aware of whom is around your bike, check it regularly and ask a trusted friend to keep an eye out if leaving it unattended. It's come to our attention that thieves are attending bike events, such as bike nights, and placing tracking devices on unattended motorbikes. These devices allow offenders to locate where bikes are kept and later steal them. Regularly check your bike for anything unusual or out of place. There is software you can get which alerts you when you are near a tracker. If you attend a bike night, try to park where you can clearly see your bike at all times. Most importantly, remain vigilant and report any suspicious behaviour around your bike or others.
