News

Officers attended on an emergency response to a report of an attempted residential burglary in Braunstone Town. Both Officers and local PCSOs attended quickly, an area search was carried out but the perpetrators had made good their escape. Officers have conducted a detailed review of CCTV, conducted house to house enquiries and forensics attended. The investigation was passed over to our detective colleagues for progression.

We're aware of a post circulating on Facebook regarding recent incidents on Darien Way. Officers attended promptly, and we can confirm the resident is safe. We have CCTV and other evidence and are actively investigating this incident and a linked report to identify those involved. Reports included items being thrown and fireworks being used, which we understand caused significant concern to both victim and the community. Please be assured: anti-social behaviour and criminal acts will not be tolerated and those responsible will face the appropriate consequences for their actions. We've seen suggestions about residents carrying out late-night patrols with self-defence items. While we appreciate the community spirit, this may not be suitable or safe and could put people at risk. Instead, please report suspicious behaviour to us via 101, or in an emergency, call 999. Our officers will continue regular patrols in the area to provide reassurance and help prevent further incidents.
