Patrols

PCSO Harffey and PCSO Dunn continue to conduct mobile foot and vehicle patrols around Moulsecoomb and Bevendean, Bates Estate and Saunders Park. Members of the public have requested more visible patrols in their area as this can provide reassurance and a deterrence to anti-social behaviour or crime. We have a large area to cover where foot patrol is not always practicable, so marked vehicle patrol covers more ground.

Ward Days and Engagement Meetings

Community engagement meetings are held monthly in the area, where we have the opportunity to engage with the community, receive feedback and offer general home safety advice and fraud prevention.

Fraud Advice

Various types of scams continue to be our biggest problem in the city and nationwide. To add an extra layer of protection to your email and social accounts, consider using 2- Step Verification (2SV) which helps to keep cyber criminals out even if they know your password. SSV, sometimes called 2-factor authentication, can usually be found in the security setting of your account.

It provides a way of double checking that you really are the person you are claiming to be. You will be asked to provide a second step which is something that only you can access. This could be a code number sent to you by text or created by an app. This would be in

addition to your password, making it doubly difficult for criminals to access your accounts. More information can be found on the GOV.UK website.
