Beat Priorities

- **Road Safety** - results from "my views" survey conducted by the local team, via Neighbourhood Link, indicate that this is a priority concern on the area.
- **Anti-Social Behaviour** - Residents have highlighted ASB around open and green space. A large area of concern around ASB related to the summer months is Rushey Filed where reports of ASB and cricket tournaments feature.
- **Burglaries** - Due to recent crime recording data, it has been highlighted that there is an **increase in residential burglaries**.

We did - We're Taking Action on Road Safety - We've been working with partner agencies and listening to your concerns to tackle road safety and anti-social behaviour in Rushey Mead. You will see


- Beat officers are patrolling schools during pick-up and drop-off times to keep everyone safe.
- Speed checks and vehicle operations are planned across the area—watch out for us!
- Joint efforts with the council have already helped improve parking issues near local schools.

- We Did -We're Taking Action on ASB - This is being tackled by the beat team through bespoke created OP Wasp. You will see –

- Local officers are regularly patrolling green spaces to tackle anti-social behaviour areas include Rushey Fields, Appleton Park, and Jessie Jackson Park.
- Working with the council, residents, and community groups to improve safety and cleanliness.
- Officers are carrying out both high-visibility and plain-clothed patrols in ASB hotspots.

We did — we're Taking action on burglaries - You will see

- Seasonal Increase in Burglaries: There is a rise in burglaries during the darker months, prompting focused action.
- Evening Patrols Local beat officers will conduct high-visibility patrols in East Leicester during evening shifts to prevent burglaries, identify offenders, and provide crime prevention advice.
- Daytime Response: Dedicated officers will visit addresses where burglaries have been reported to collect evidence and offer crime prevention and target-hardening support.
- Community Support: Beat surgeries are held to provide the local community with practical guidance on preventing crime.



PC Bramley and PC Wallis have been tackling road safety which is one of the Rushey Meads Beat priorities.

Vehicles have been seized by officers for driving with no insurance, driving otherwise in accordance with a licence at all!

Fatal 4 (speeding, no seatbelts, mobile phones and drink/drug driving) is one of Leicestershire Police's priorities.


What we have been doing in your area!
